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# TEN STEPS TO THE FIELD





# 1. SECURE YOUR SPOT

## A. SUBMIT YOUR DEPOSIT

In order to secure your groups chosen trip dates, please make a **\$250 deposit** within three weeks of your acceptance. Please note that this is not a per person fee, but is a group deposit. In the event of a cancellation, the deposit is non-refundable and non-transferrable and will be used to cover all administrative and cancellation fees.

**To submit your deposit, or to make payments on your remaining trip balance, please use one of the following methods:**

You may submit your trip deposit in any of the following ways:

1. Online: You can go online to [www.impactafrica.org/invest-now](http://www.impactafrica.org/invest-now). Select "Where Needed Most," and then type your group's name in the "Leave Us a Note" box at the bottom. Fill in the rest of the information and submit.

## B. COMPLETE YOUR GROUP AGREEMENT FORM

Upon acceptance, you will receive a Group Agreement Form outlining the trip details that we have agreed upon thus far, as well as Impact Africa's various policies in regards to hosting your group. Please sign this form and send us a scanned copy two weeks after your acceptance.





## 2. FUNDRAISE

**IMPACT AFRICA IS A 501(c)(3) NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATION, WHICH MEANS THAT ALL DONATIONS RECEIVED FOR YOUR TRIP ARE TAX-DEDUCTIBLE AND NON-REFUNDABLE**

### **WHAT DOES THE TRIP COST INCLUDE?**

Your estimated total trip cost for your unique trip will be sent to you in your acceptance email. This trip cost covers all relevant on-the-ground costs such as housing, meals, in-country transportation, ministry training, ministry supplies, and any agreed-upon free day activities.

### **WHAT DOES THE TRIP COST NOT INCLUDE?**

The total trip cost does not include airfare, incidentals, international insurance (required), or personal spending money for each person. Your trip cost is subject to change if there are any major fluctuations in the exchange rate, however, your trip price will be confirmed and locked in 6 months before your trip date.







# HOW CAN I START FUNDRAISING?

As you speak to people, be sure to remember to cast the vision and heart for the trip. You and your group are plugging into our long-term strategies to evangelize and disciple South Africans. Therefore, you and your partners are investing into a long-term impact that goes beyond your short-term trip!

As you fundraise, it is important to remember that you actually have to ask people to support you; not just pray about supporting your trip. We find that it is best to ask people for a specific amount, but to be flexible with any amount that they would like to give. It is also helpful to inform each potential partner that their gift is tax-deductible. Lastly, always remember to say,

***“Thank you!”***





# 3. PASSPORTS

Each participant is required to have a valid passport with at least 2 blank visa pages, and which cannot expire within 6 months after you depart South Africa. It can take 6-12 weeks to process and receive a passport, so you will need to apply immediately if you do not already have one (you can apply online at [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov)). If you are a U.S. or Canadian citizen, you will receive a 90-day visitor's visa upon arrival in South Africa, which is free of charge, and no paperwork is required. If you are not a U.S. or Canadian citizen, please be sure to contact Jordan ([jordan@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordan@impactafrica.org)), as you may need to apply for a visa. As the team leader, you should have copies of all the participants' passports prior to traveling.



# 4. INTERNATIONAL FLIGHTS

Each group is responsible for booking their own flights. We have two recommended options for you to use as travel agencies. First, you may use Skypass Travel Inc. (214-634-8687). Ask for Anita ([anita@skypasstravel.com](mailto:anita@skypasstravel.com)) and let her know that you are booking for a trip with Impact Africa. Or you can use High Point ([highpointgo.com](http://highpointgo.com)). You can contact Chris ([chris@highpointgo.com](mailto:chris@highpointgo.com)) and let him know you are booking for a trip with Impact Africa. In order to book tickets for each participant, you will need to know their legal name as it appears on their passport, their passport number, and their date of birth. If your team is joining one of our preset trips, please refer to the arrival and departure parameters given by your trip representative. If you have customized your trip dates, then you are free to choose the arrival and departure times that best suit your team.



# 5. SUBMIT TEAM PAYMENT

Please send your team payment using the method discussed with your trip representative (which may be via check, bank wire, or USD cash brought to South Africa). Payment is due by the time you arrive.

# 6. HEALTH COVERAGE

It is required that each participant has international health insurance coverage to participate on our trip. If someone is not covered internationally through their personal insurance, please have them purchase a temporary missionary health insurance plan for the dates of the trip. We recommend using [www.missiontripinsurance.com](http://www.missiontripinsurance.com), however people may use whichever service they prefer, as long as it covers internationally. As the team leader, please be sure to have copies of each persons health coverage while you are on your trip.







## 7. COMPLETE IMMIGRATION DOCUMENTS

### ONLY FOR MINORS UNDER THE AGE OF 18

If anyone on your trip will be under the age of 18 at the time of the trip, please contact Jordan at [jordane@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordane@impactafrica.org). All participants under the age of 18 will be required to complete immigration documents in order to travel to and from South Africa, due to new immigration laws in South Africa.

## 8. PREPARE FOR MINISTRY

Upon arrival, your team will receive ministry training from our highly qualified staff members so that you are prepared and equipped to effectively share the Gospel! However, we highly recommend and strongly encourage you to prepare yourself now for ministry here in South Africa. Please read through this manual in its entirety for helpful tips for preparation. You may also reach out to us at any time with questions in order to help your team prepare. Please review all trip guidelines prior to departure, which can be found on page 21.

## 9. TEAM ROSTER

Please fill out the Team Roster and send to [jordane@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordane@impactafrica.org) at least one month prior to your trip. Be sure to fill it out in its entirety, making sure to designate any married couples or families, as well as team leaders.

# TRIP LOGISTICS







## HOUSING:

There are three main facilities that Impact Africa uses to host teams. We have been using these facilities for many years, and have found them all to be reliable, clean, and safe. Where you will be staying will depend on the size of your team as well as availability of our housing facilities, however all facilities are located in the Gauteng province. These simple and modest accommodations will provide twin size beds, normal toilets, and hot showers; all of the basic amenities that you will need for your mission trip experience! Girls and guys will not share rooms or bathrooms (unless they are family and request to be housed together).

Please note that there is no heat or air conditioning, so it can get very cold in the winter, and very hot in the summer. South Africa is in the Southern Hemisphere, and therefore is on the opposite seasonal schedule of North America; which means it is fall/winter from Mar - Aug, and spring/summer from Sept - Feb



## COMMUNICATION:

Upon arrival, you will be able to call or message home to let families know that you have arrived safely. Please know that there will be limited Wi-Fi connectivity opportunities. The leader will have a Wi-Fi hot-spot device to post daily updates for the team as a whole, and to use for any emergencies.

If you would like to ensure that you can communicate with your loved ones back home daily, then you may want to look into an international phone plan with your service provider. About one or two weeks before your trip starts, we will send out an email detailing instructions for how your family can contact us at any time if they may need to reach you, and how they can receive daily updates about your trip. Please know that we will ensure that you can reach home at any time, and that your family can contact you at any time.

## TRANSPORTATION:

For your in-country transportation, we will use a trusted local bus company, as well as our own private vehicles. We have worked with this company for many years, as they have a great safety record, and the bus will remain with the team 24/7 during your stay in Africa.





## FOOD:

During your stay, breakfast and dinner will be provided by the housing facility and/or Impact Africa staff, and then you'll have lunch out on ministry. Lunch will typically consist of peanut butter and jelly and/or deli-meat sandwiches, chips, fruit, and cookies.

Please notify us if you have any food allergies so that we can plan accordingly. Depending on the type of food allergy, you may be asked to bring additional food to supplement your meals.

## SAFETY PROTOCOL:

The safety of our guests, staff, interns, and nationals is of utmost importance. We have safety protocols set in place to ensure the well-being of each individual.



- When out in the squatter camps, each participant will be in a group of at least 4 people, which must include at least 1 male member.
- You will be instructed during training how to interact with those in the community who are extremely ill, or a child who falls and scrapes their knee - we ask that you and your team comfort/pray from afar as we have found that this is the best way to keep your team safe.
- The housing facility is fully secured by an electric fence and guards.
- We will always travel in groups and at appropriate times of the day (i.e. not late at night).



# **SOUTH AFRICA WEATHER**

**APRIL – AUGUST: 35-65 degrees F**

**SEPTEMBER – NOVEMBER: 45-75 degrees F**

**DECEMBER – MARCH: 50-95 degrees F**

Please note that South Africa is in the Southern Hemisphere, and therefore on the opposite seasonal schedule of North America; which means it is fall/winter from March – August, and spring/summer from September – February.

Winter time in South Africa means it gets very cold at night and in the mornings, and warms up during the day. Winter apparel is highly recommended as is layering for varying temperatures. There is NO central heating, so when it is 40 degrees outside, it is that (and sometimes colder) inside.

## **DRESS ATTIRE:**

As Christians and Missionaries, it is important to maintain a level of excellence and cultural sensitivity in the image we portray throughout the communities. We request that team members always maintain a neat and presentable appearance. In the event that a staff member of Impact Africa notices a team member in violation of the guidelines or an activity that is inappropriate, it will be brought to the leaders' attention or be addressed with the individual.

When out in the squatter camps, your clothes will become dirty, so please bring appropriate clothing and shoes. You will be required to wear closed toed shoes when out in the squatter camps. For the fun activities (African Safari, Lion Park, and dinner out) you can wear more "normal" clothes as long as they are appropriate and modest. For African church, the guys should wear nice dress pants with a nice shirt (Khakis and a polo type shirt is acceptable), and the ladies should wear a long skirt or long pants and nice top, or a long modest dress.

Due to cultural sensitivity as well as modesty, girls, as well as guys, are not allowed to wear tank tops or shorts of any kind in the squatter camps. We recommend wearing capris, long skirts, or other long pants (i.e. jeans or khakis) with a t- shirt while out on ministry. Guys are also expected to wear long pants while out on ministry. We also ask that all participants do not wear any clothing items that display profanity, alcohol, dark humor, or anything else that may convey a negative message. While in the housing complex or on your free day, you may wear tank tops and shorts as long as they are modest in length (tank tops at least three fingers in width; shorts at least as long as your fingertips when hands are at your sides.)

## WHEN DECIDING WHAT TO PACK FOR YOUR TRIP, PLEASE REVIEW THE FOLLOWING NOTES CAREFULLY SO THAT YOU CAN ENSURE THAT YOU WILL BE FULLY PREPARED WITH THE APPROPRIATE NECESSITIES FOR YOUR TRIP.

1. You are allowed to bring one personal item (backpack/purse), one carry-on (15-20 pounds depending on airline), and two (depending on airline) checked pieces of luggage (up to 50 pounds). It is recommended, but not required, to purchase a TSA-approved lock to lock your checked pieces of luggage for safe-keeping.
2. Theft is always a possibility when you travel abroad, so please do not bring anything that you cannot afford to lose. Make sure that each piece of your luggage meets your specific airline's weight and size requirements for both checked and carry-on luggage.
3. Please bring enough clothing to last you for at least 2 weeks. Although we do have access to laundry machines, sometimes the water or power goes out and you would not be able to wash clothes during that time. In addition, please remember that you want to bring a few outfits for church and free days.
4. Ladies, please know that leggings/tights are not permitted to be worn as pants during ministry. You may wear leggings/tights for your pajamas or under your clothing for added warmth. You can also wear them around the base or on outings as long as your shirt covers your bottom.
5. For your electronic items, South Africa uses round-pin, three-prong plugs (type M) for their outlets. Cheap adapters can be purchased on Amazon or at Target/Walmart. Please note that the voltage in South Africa is 220/230 volts (as opposed to 120 volts in the U.S.), and adapters DO NOT convert the power voltage; only the plug shape. The voltage difference won't be an issue for small items such as chargers for phones, laptops, or cameras; however, it may be an issue for other electronics such as flat irons or hair dryers, so please be sure to check that the voltage is compatible with 220/230 volts.

# TRIP GUIDELINES

**PLEASE REVIEW THESE GUIDELINES PRIOR TO ARRIVAL SO THAT YOU ARE FULLY AWARE OF OUR EXPECTATIONS FOR EACH PARTICIPANT. WE HAVE FOUND THAT THESE GUIDELINES HELP ENSURE AND FACILITATE A GOOD EXPERIENCE FOR YOU, OUR STAFF AND INTERNS, AND THE LOCALS.**

- No illegal drugs, alcohol, or tobacco are allowed
- Please respect your fellow teammates by not using profanity or fighting.
- Males and females will not be using the same bedrooms or bathrooms, unless family and previously requested to be housed together.  
We ask that non-married team members avoid public displays of affection.
- In order to maintain a respectful attitude, we ask that there be no romantic involvement (including excessive flirting) with Impact Africa staff, interns, volunteers, or nationals.  
As a safety precaution, everyone should stay in his/her designated ministry group and not wander off alone during ministry or engage with people in the communities who may be intoxicated.
- Handing out toys, candy, food, tracts, or any other items should be reserved for private situations (such as in a home) as opposed to crowds in order to avoid attracting unnecessary attention.  
Please be on time for all meals as this will ensure that everyone is included in any announcements or important information, as well as will help our kitchen staff to best serve your whole team.  
Please abide by the dress code previously detailed in this guide in order to remain culturally sensitive and maintain a standard of modesty as Christians and missionaries.
- If at any point an Impact Africa staff member gives the team instructions, please listen attentively and act promptly as we are always looking out for your best interest as our guests.

# FAQ

**ARE PAYMENTS TAX-DEDUCTIBLE?** Yes! All payments/donations are tax-deductible and non-refundable as we are a registered 501(c)3 non-profit organization. When sending checks, please be sure to write your unique fundraising code in the memo line of the check so that we know it's for you. Please ONLY write the alphanumeric code and NOT your name, and this can affect the tax-deductibility of the donation.

**ARE THERE ANY UNEXPECTED EXPENSES?** The only unexpected expenses will be any form of emergency (medical, missed flight, etc.).

**HOW ARE FLIGHTS PURCHASED?** If you are traveling alone, we will purchase your flights for you, as we find that this is the best way to keep the trip preparation process as simple for you as possible, as well as it allows us to ensure that you will fly together with the other participants to Johannesburg. This also allows the cost of your plane ticket to be tax-deductible! Please remember to have the cost of your airfare in your Impact Africa account 10 weeks before your trip so that we can purchase your ticket.

**WILL I NEED A PASSPORT?** Yes! You will need a valid passport that does not expire within 6 months after your trip and with at least two blank visa pages. For information on how to apply for a new passport, renew your passport, or add visa pages please visit [www.travel.state.gov](http://www.travel.state.gov).

**WILL I NEED A VISA?** No. Upon arrival in South Africa, you will automatically receive a 90-day visa, and this is free of charge and does not require any paperwork. If you are NOT a U.S. citizen, please contact us ([jordan@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordan@impactafrica.org)), as you may need to apply for a visa.

**IS THERE AN AGE LIMIT?** Our trips are primarily open to individuals who are 16 years old and above; however, if there is a participant who is under the age of 16 they may be permitted to participate if there is an accompanying family member or guardian. For more information, please contact us at [jordan@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordan@impactafrica.org).

**IS THERE ADDITIONAL INFORMATION OR PAPERWORK FOR MINORS (under the age of 18)**

**TRAVELING TO AND FROM SOUTH AFRICA?** Yes, South Africa has implemented immigration laws for anyone under the age of 18 who is traveling to and from South Africa. There will be additional paperwork that each participant under the age of 18 must complete and have with them as they travel. We are very familiar with this process and the paperwork required, so we will assist you as you prepare these documents.

**WHAT IF I HAVE FOOD ALLERGIES?** If you have any form of food allergies (gluten, nuts, etc.) you are still able to come on the trip! Please be sure to mention any food allergies or any other form of allergy on the Team Roster. Please note that depending on your allergy, you may be asked to bring food to supplement your meals.



**WHAT IS THE VOLTAGE FOR ELECTRICITY?** The South African electricity supply is 220/230 volts AC 50 HZ (as opposed to 110/120 volts in the U.S.). Most plugs are 15 amp 3-prong or 5 amp 2-prong, with round pins. The Type M adapter will allow you to plug your U.S. electronics into South African outlets, and can be purchased on Amazon. Please note that adapters only change the shape of the plug, but DO NOT convert the power voltage. This means that for smaller electronics, such as phone and camera chargers, they will work just fine; however, for larger electronics/small appliances, such as hair dryers, the power voltage will not convert properly, and will ruin both the appliance and the outlet. Please make sure that whatever electronics you choose to bring (which shouldn't be much more than a phone or camera charger), that they will be compatible with the voltage in South Africa. Here is a picture of what the type M adapter should look like:



**WHAT WILL WE BE EATING?** Breakfast and dinner will be provided by Impact Africa caterers and enjoyed in the dining room. Lunch will be deli-meat and/or PB&J sandwiches out on the ministry.

Breakfast Example: Eggs, porridge/oatmeal, toast, cereal and South African sausage

Lunch: Meat and cheese sandwiches, fruit, and chips.

Dinner Example: Beef stew with rice and veggies, chicken with roasted potatoes and salad, etc.

**IS THE WATER SAFE TO DRINK?** Yes! The water is safe to drink in South Africa.

**WILL THERE BE COFFEE?** Our housing complexes do serve either instant coffee or regular coffee in the morning with breakfast, however if you have a favorite instant coffee that you like, you are more than welcome to bring your own as well!

**WHAT TYPES OF MEDICINE OR VACCINATIONS ARE RECOMMENDED?** Impact Africa/South Africa does not require any vaccinations or malaria medication for North Americans, however you may consult your doctor for travel recommendations.

**WHAT TYPE OF MINISTRY WILL I BE DOING?** During your trip, you will have the opportunity to share your personal testimony, share the hope of Jesus, and pray with people through house to house evangelism. You will also have the opportunity to love on all of the kiddos as you help us lead our Jabulani Kids VBS-style program in the communities. Other special ministry opportunities may be available depending on the season and your unique group.

**WHAT WILL OUR SCHEDULE LOOK LIKE?** Each trip kicks off with ministry and cultural training lead by the Impact Africa staff. Your day is packed with a wide range of ministry, so we begin the mornings with quiet time and prayer. The evenings are completely flexible and available for free time, additional training, teachings, or fun team time activities. Here is an example of what your typical ministry day may look like (please note that this is subject to change based on availability of various ministry opportunities):

7:00 a.m. Devotions  
8:00 a.m. Breakfast  
8:45 a.m. Travel to ministry site  
9:00 a.m. Personal evangelism  
12:00 p.m. Lunch  
1:00 p.m. Personal evangelism  
3:00 p.m. Jabulani Kids  
4:00 p.m. Program Ministry debrief and prayer  
4:30 p.m. Travel back to housing site  
6:00 p.m. Dinner  
7:00 p.m. Free Time / Team Time

Your adventure includes a full day African Safari, a nice African dinner out, and souvenir shopping at one of our premier parks in South Africa. We will also take some time at the end of the trip to debrief your team so that each member can properly process all that they have experienced and learned during their mission trip.

**WHAT SHOULD I BRING?** Please refer to the 'Dress Attire' and 'Packing List' for more information on what to bring.

**CAN I BRING SUPPLIES TO DONATE?** Yes! If you would like to bring any supplies to donate, please send an email to Jordan at [jordan@impactafrica.org](mailto:jordan@impactafrica.org), so that we can let you know what our biggest needs are at that time.

**WHAT HAPPENS IF THERE IS AN EMERGENCY?** Safety is our number one priority for each participant. We are very aware of our surroundings and will not bring a team into any area that may seem unsafe for any reason. Each housing facility is about 15–20 minutes from a hospital should we need to take anyone to the doctor for any reason. We will notify parents as soon as possible if any form of emergency arises.

**WILL THERE BE WI-FI AVAILABLE?** Upon arrival in South Africa, each participant will contact home to let their families know that they have arrived safely. There may be one or two opportunities to connect to Wi-Fi, but you should expect to have limited Wi-Fi connectivity. If you would like, you may look into purchasing a temporary international plan through your provider if you wish to have additional data connectivity to stay connected with family and friends throughout the trip.

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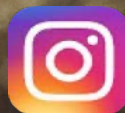
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
