

## Tremble at His Word

Scripture Reference: Isaiah 66:2

- Many have attempted to develop and \_\_\_\_\_ a relationship with God on their own terms.
- Hebrew word *Nabat*. To look, to watch, to regard, to be \_\_\_\_\_ focused on something.

5. Obey God to completion.
