#### PASTOR NOTES FOR FALL 2024:

#### YOU STAY INSPIRED, SAN DIEGO! (OOPS, I MEAN... BUCKINGHAM!)

In the classic comedy "Anchorman," Will Ferrell's TV news anchor character Ron Burgundy always ends his nightly broadcast with the words "You stay classy, San Diego." After they've received the news from him, he holds them – and invites them all to hold each other - to a higher standard.

As the summer ends, so does our worship series **SPIRIT INSPIRED!** in which we've been looking at the presence of the Holy Spirit in every part of our liturgy. As we bring this series (which began May 19 on Pentecost Sunday!) to a close, I'm inclined to say to us all (not "stay classy" - because aren't we always!) but rather: Stay Inspired Buckingham! Stay focused. Stay in tune and lifted higher by the presence and the movement of the Holy Spirit every time you worship - whether in a service on Sunday or throughout your life lived in worship.

- 1. LITURGY: We looked at the structure of our service as a whole and defined "liturgy" as "the work of the people." A church service is our weekly practice session for the work we are called to do in the world as followers of Jesus Christ.
- 2. CALL TO WORSHIP: The "call to worship" is an invitation to give our full attention to God in worship.
- 3. PRAYER: Prayer is at "the heart of worship" and it is "the primary way in which we participate in worship." There are many ways to pray: corporately (using words), silently (prayed in quiet) and the all-important confessional prayer in which we stand in grace together.
- 4. WORD(!): The Word of God is central to Reformed/Protestant worship. The scriptures read and proclaimed help us understand - more and more every time we hear and discern them - the relationship God wants to have with us and desires for us to have with each other.
- 5. SACRAMENTS: Baptism and the Lord's Supper are visible signs (water, bread/juice) of God's amazing grace. Both mark us and remind us of the power and presence of the Spirit which moves in and through us every day of our lives.
- 6. AFFIRMATION of FAITH: We take time in most worship services to recite together words from the creeds or confessions of the Church. We do so in recognition that the Holy Spirit has inspired the church since day one in its reformed and always reforming understanding of what it means to follow Jesus and Be the Church. The affirmation of faith is not meant to force someone to say something they may not believe - but an invitation to ask questions and wrestle together with the things that we proclaim as Christians.
- 7. OFFERTORY: The offertory isn't just about "giving money to the church." It's a time to pray for and practice ways in which we may offer something of ourselves to God in response for God's amazing gifts given to us all. Most especially the gift of God's son Jesus who gave His life for all. Our offertory is meant to extend outward into the lives of the local, national and global community.
- 8. MUSIC!: What a celebration of worship music we had on Sunday, July 28 on the front lawn lifting our songs of praise and thanksgiving, lament and trust to God! Let us remember that we worship God with music - but we do not worship the music itself. It's ALL good if it brings our attention to God.
- 9. SENDING: We come to worship only to Go!...back out into the world to share the good news of the Gospel and invite others to know its power for their lives. Remember: The best tool for evangelism is personal invitation into the life of the church.

Wow – that's a lot! I know I feel inspired, and I hope you do too by the MANY WAYS the Holy Spirit moves in and through the liturgy, our work as people of faith and our lives lived in worship.

Here's one last <u>Burning Question</u> for you: How will you continue to focus and feel the presence of the Spirit in worship? Who will you invite to enjoy its presence with us in the life of Buckingham church? What burning questions might you continue to have that may be answered for you at a weekly Bible study? (We meet most Thursdays at 6:00. All are invited!)

Summer may be over – but our lives lived in Spirit-inspired worship go on and on. I look forward to the fall and all Spirit-Inspired worship with you. I hope to see you soon. (And don't forget - you may always find us Sunday mornings on ZOOM. Check your weekly church email for the link.)

Stay inspired, Buckingham and know that God loves you – and so do I.

With all 13 people working hard, we were able to serve 3 types of chicken, corn on the cob from the garden, salad, warm bread, fruit skewers, mac and cheese, cookies, brownies, and caramel corn. And after dinner the youth led the most amazing Activity Hour for the children staying at the house. Each child in the house received a new pillowcase made by Sewing Seeds of Love. It was an experience none of us will forget. Before we left that night, youth were asking how soon we could return and do it again. The next morning we went to the Zoo where the favorite animal was decided to be the Penguins! We received a grant from the Presbytery for \$750 to help cover our costs and are grateful for their support.















The last week of June the whole church was full of the sounds of children, youth, and adults having fun at Breaker Rock Beach. For five nights, Buckingham was the place to be with games, crafts, stories, science experiments, dinner, snacks, singing, dancing. We learned that God's Truth Never Changes. A huge thank you to everyone who volunteered their time and talents to make this week possible. Each night we had at least 25 volunteers. And we had more than 70 kids who registered from around our area with 55-60 in attendance each night. We raised more than \$350 for the Ronald McDonald House through our offerings and to show their support for the amazing kids and youth Mother Suz, Pastor Mark, and Pastor Susannah all got slimed on Friday night.
