- The <u>Buffet</u> is open seating in Fellowship Hall between 9:00 and 10:45.a.m. so folks may eat/sit at their leisure. New this year: We will have a small number of 'reserved' tables available in Room E-F for parties of 6 or more. Inquire when buying tickets.
- The <u>Program</u> will start at 11:00 am in the Sanctuary and include music, laughter, reflection, and inspiration as we prepare our hearts and minds for Christmas. Our speaker is our beloved Janet Rowe and, yes, the Steves and the Bobs will also be with us!
- <u>Tickets</u> continue to be just \$10 and will be on sale on the patio before and between services on Sundays, Nov 17, 24, and Dec 1. Payment should be in cash or check made out to CPC with WAE in the memo line. If you're unable to be at worship, folks can also purchase tickets through noon Monday, Dec 2, by calling Stella in the church office at 520-886-5686. Don't worry if you don't have your physical ticket with you on Dec 7 as we will have a full list of all purchasers and your name tag will be ready! 

have hatched an altogether different plan for Emmett's future.

Some folks have asked about Pink Pick-Ups Furniture Taxi (520-268-5670). They are an independently owned moving company that will move your donations to CPC or your entire household to any location. The Flea Market Team hires them to move and store boxes after Secondhand Weekends and to do heavy lifting for the Flea Market each March. Since we don't collect donations, we encourage you to call Pink Pick-Ups' owner, Nathan Heuser for a free estimate. The charge hourly, with a one-minimum of \$125-\$150, depending on the volume and distance.

Exodus Community Services - These are the guys who help us every year at the Flea Market! It is a great organization that has been the beneficiary of donations from CPC. Exodus currently has three operating homes. They are included in the State of Arizona Tax exemption. Homes like these are now losing the support of the State of Arizona. So when you are thinking about your 2024 taxes and need a great State tax break, this is a good one to support. Arizona allows you to take a dollar-for-dollar credit on your state taxes when you donate up to \$470 for single filers, or \$938 for married couples filing jointly to a qualified organization. 
