








Get Ready for Lent



Lent (the six Sundays before the celebration of Jesus' Resurrection) begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18th. Throughout the season of Lent (and the liturgical color is Purple), Pastor Steve will lead a worship and study on Philip Yancey's book: *Vanishing Grace*.

It's a weekly study of how Christians need to reclaim the peaceful grace of Christ as we share our faith with others in the world. You are encouraged to buy the book,

Vanishing Grace, and begin reading now so that you can more fully grow in your faith and the conversations we will have during the season of Lent. Pastor Steve will hold online and in-person classes to go deeper in the study in that season.

Piano Recital January 25, 2026, 2 p.m.

A 7-foot Steinway piano has been gifted to our church by Eleanor Livingston. This piano originally belonged to her grandmother. 

Now that we are refreshed and ready to start again with our sorting, cleaning & pricing for the upcoming 15th annual Flea Market scheduled for March 12, 13 & 14, 2026. If you can help one or both days to prepare for this giant fundraising activity, it would be most appreciated!

2nd Hand Schedules:

Saturday: 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. Lunch provided. Donations are accepted until 2 p.m.

Sunday: 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. Lunch provided. Donations are accepted only until noon to allow for processing by the end of the same day.

In an effort to decrease the number of discarded plastic water bottles on the planet, we now have a water dispenser set up in the MPR kitchen for refilling our personal bottles.

Flea Market Donation reminders:

- We no longer pick up donations. See the pink box about Pink Pick Ups Furniture Taxi
- When donating electronic items, please include and attach all necessary cords, transformers, remotes, and accessories to the item being donated.
- We sell only items that are clean and in good working order. Please wash or dust the donated items before bringing them in.
- Clothes and linens that are stained, ripped, faded, or worn out are not included in the sale.
- We no longer accept non-flat screen TVs, mattresses, large appliances, pianos or organs, items with broken or missing pieces (including furniture), paint, flammable or poisonous items.

Pink Pick Ups Furniture Taxi

The Flea Market Team hires Pink Pick Ups to move boxes after Secondhand Weekends and to work at the Flea Market each March. Consider contacting owner Nathan Heuser for a free estimate. He charges hourly, with a one-hour minimum of \$125-\$150, depending on the volume and distance. He prefers texting at 520-268-5670. Please plan ahead and allow 2-3 days for a callback.
