10/6 Connecting with Others. The Surgeon General has recently identified a loneliness epidemic in the US. What can Christians do to engage others with compassion and empathy?



Halloween Festival and Trunk or Treat Saturday, October 26th, 6-8 p.m.

We will again host our annual Halloween Festival for the community. We've had 500-1000 people show up from year to year to celebrate the season safely. We host the festival with games, hot dogs, and Trunk-or-Treat. AND WE NEED YOUR HELP! We'll have sign ups out on Sundays, and available online.

Trunk-or-Treat: Arrive at 5:15 p.m. Park in spots off Broadway (by Marquee). Decorate your trunk or back of vehicle, dress up if you want, bring a chair and a couple bags of candy (we will supplement), and hand out candy as people come through. DO NOT Leave until 8 p.m. when we close.

Games: Robin has lots of games for you to run. Arrive at 5:15 p.m. for placement and training in the Gym.

General Greeter: arrive 5:15 p.m. Welcome and direct people to activities, take extra bags of candy to trunk-or-treat folks to hand out, and help out wherever needed.

Hot Dogs: arrive 5:15 p.m. in Fellowship Hall. Help set up and hand out hot dogs.

Clean Up: 8 p.m. we close and clean up. Clean up goes pretty fast!

Candy: We need bags of individually wrapped candy. Drop off bags On Sundays or at the church office.



In August we held a presentation on Five Wishes, a program that helps plan for unexpected and sudden illnesses or injuries. Five Wishes is a living will (also called an advance directive) and a Medical Power of Attorney that ensures your medical wishes are known by your family, caregivers, and medical professionals in the event you are unable to make medical decisions for yourself.





Our book for October is *The Only Woman in the Room* by Marie Benedict.


Bestselling author Marie Benedict reveals the story of a brilliant woman scientist only remembered for her beauty.

Pink Pick-Ups Furniture Taxi is an independently owned moving company that will move your entire household or your donations for the Flea Market. The Flea Market Team hires them to move and store boxed donations after Secondhand Weekends and for the heavy lifting jobs associated with the Flea Market each March. We no longer have volunteers to collect your donations. If you have large or heavy items to transport to the church, consider hiring Pink Pick-Up. Call the owner, Nathan Heuser for a free estimate. The charge by the hour, with an one-hour minimum, is \$125-\$150, depending on distance and volume.
