Avery is a child who simply cannot handle certain pitches, sounds, and volumes. It sets her off. She begins to get anxious and upset, and if she is not removed from the situation or she cannot dampen the noise, she hyperventilates and cries.

Some people I've been with have been annoyed or embarrassed, but I don't care. This is how God made Avery and this is how we have learned to help her enjoy all aspects of her life. If my child needed glasses, I would get her glasses. If she needed braces, I'd get her braces. Well, in certain situations she needs headphones, and so she gets headphones.

If your child is ever in need of assistance, please don't hesitate to get it for them, no matter what other people think. Whether that be getting them evaluated for a learning disorder, a physical disability, or simply needing a little extra help in their life, help them to live the best and most enjoyable life they can.

I thank God every day that we worship at Memorial. Memorial is a congregation which accepts and loves everyone and appreciates the different ways that they can praise, worship, and serve the Lord to the utmost of their abilities. No one here has ever made Avery feel any different or less than for her sensitivities, and we know what a rare and amazing gift that is.
