

#### **UNAPOLOGETICALLY CHRISTIAN**

Recently, while visiting family, the host announced that they had arranged a babysitter for all the kids so that the adults could have a nice dinner out. My immediate reaction was to ask "Who is this person? How do you know them? What do you know about them and how they are around *children?"* And then I realized that asking questions was me trying to justify mine and Jack's rules, which are "No one we don't know watches our kids." And so, I said "No, but thank you." Though I felt guilty at first for having them change and eventually cancel some plans, I decided to be unapologetically me. These are our rules for our children, and we will not apologize.

The same approach should be taken to our faith. Here in what is deemed the holiday season, we hit a multitude of different religious holidays. There's Christmas, Hannukah, Kwanzaa, a multitude of Saint's days. and I'm sure many more. And we should absolutely respect one another's rights to have different beliefs and practice those beliefs as we see fit. But that means that we should respect our own rights and unapologetically embrace our own faith during the holiday season and beyond.

Many find no issue with being unapologetically Christian during the Christmas season. But what about beyond Christmas? What about when we are out of the cocoon of the songs, movie, shopping, decorations, and general spirit of the season being dubbed "Christmas," whether they be Christocentric or not? What about when it is not "our time" of the year?

I will tell you one thing, it is always our time of the year. Christ did not come down for one day, but he came to save us for all of eternity. Christ was born, lived a perfect life, died, and rose again to save us for all time. He endured heartache (Jn 11), betrayal (Lk 22), excruciating pain (Mk 15), and death (Mt 27), knowingly and refusing to turn away from it (Mt 26) all for our salvation. Christ deserves more from us than just recognition at Christmas, He deserves us to be unapologetic followers and proclaimers all year long. So unapologetically celebrate and proclaim Christ not just this Christmas, but each and every day.


