THE MEANING OF CHRISTMAS

Penellope Jenkins was alone on the train. It was meandering through the wheat fields of Kansas to a small town she had never heard of. This was going to be her first teaching job, having recently graduated from a prestigious ivy league school in the northeast. A one room school with all 11 grades together would be a challenge.

The next morning she met with the school trustees, a banker and two farmers. They explained that they wanted her to "learn" the kids "Readin, Riten and Rithmetic." "Oh, by the way, you're responsible for the Christmas Pageant. Every child must have a part. The teacher you are replacing didn't do a very good job, but don't worry, the props are all made and there are books with all the words. It is the story about the birth of Jesus."

School started the next week and while teaching the "3 Rs" she was constantly thinking about "Who should I cast as an angel? Who could be a shepherd?" By October she had identified someone for all the parts... except for Johnny.

Johnny was a 5th grader, described by his parents as a "slow" student. He had difficulty speaking, remembering things, couldn't sing and was allergic to wool. She finally settled on him being the inn keeper, with only one line to learn and deliver; "There's no room in the inn." Johnny was thrilled! He had never been in a play with a speaking part. He practiced every day.

The night of the pageant, the one room school was packed. Johnny, behind the inn door, had been listening to the Bible readings, the angels singing, the shepherd's excitement and Joseph and Mary's talk of having a baby.

There was a knock on the inn door. Johnny opened it and said ,"There's no room in the inn." Joseph said "Please sir, my wife is expecting a baby and it is so cold." "There's no room in the Inn."

Joseph turned to walk away. Johnny, caught up in the moment, with tears in his eyes shouted "Wait! You can have my room!

The curtain came down. Penellope cried and so did others who realized they had witnessed the meaning of Christmas.


