SHOWING CHRIST IN A DIFFICULT SEASON

Christians live in the world and, rightly so, most of us have interest in elections. We want officials that will provide not only the most for us and our fellow citizens, we also want officials that will make policies that are conducive for the cause of Christ to thrive.

Emotionally charged presidential elections are not a new thing in the United States. They all seem significant and most of them are.

We will all do well to take the advice a brother in Christ, Isaac Errett, wrote in The Christian Standard in 1880:

"In view of the coming presidential campaign, we deem it wise to speak a word of warning ... After the political excitement is fairly ablaze, warnings will be largely ineffective ... Keep away from the unhallowed excitements that are sure to deaden all pious sentiment and sweep the soul away from its spiritual moorings ... If we enter into political contests at all, we should carry Christian dignity and honesty and common sense along with us. If we cannot do this, then let us not go into the way of temptations that are sure to prove too strong for us. As a safeguard ... begin now ... regular closet exercises of reading, meditation and prayer, and let nothing divert you from this ... Pray with your family every day. Determine to be regular at the public worship on the Lord's Day, and see to it that the kingdom of God has a fair share of your labor and money ... Go with a firm purpose that your Christian dignity shall not be compromised ... Engage in no dirty work for your party ... Avoid association with the drunken and profane. And let your light so shine that others, seeing your good works, shall glorify your Father in heaven. "
