## "Commit to the Lord Whatever You Do, and He Will Establish Your Plans"...Proverbs 16:3

A few weeks ago, I was driving to church with my three-year daughter, Olivia, in the back seat. Like most toddlers, she has recently started talking about different things she sees as we drive around town. She saw the church building while we were driving down Echo Lane and said, "That's my church" followed by "Daddy, do you want to come to my church?"

At first, her words didn't mean much to me, but she said it again and I thought about how our building reminds her of so many wonderful things the church family inside, the volunteers that teach her about Jesus, and the playground where she runs and slides with her friends.

As the facilities chairman for Memorial, I care so much about our buildings and want them to last for generations. Our campus currently has approximately 84,000 square feet of space (which is about 40 average sized houses.) It's a challenge to keep everything running properly and our facilities team has done an amazing job over the last few years. However, it's time we invest in our campus to replace some of the systems that are at the end of their useful life.

Memorial has a history of generosity, from the donations that enabled the construction of the original building 60 years ago and the Family Center 40 years ago to the education building and chapel with our last campaign. More recently, generous giving helped us purchase a new chiller to improve our air conditioning system. This small project will pay significant rewards, but we can't stop there. The additional phases of the Master Plan need to be fulfilled to ensure Memorial is thriving for the next 70 years.

As we look to future projects, I am most excited about the potential for the Worship Center. We have renovated the room over the years, but it's time for a complete transformation. The Master Plan includes a ground-up rebuild to change the configuration and experience. We want our facilities to attract new members to join us in worship and fellowship.

Design work is already underway for a Family Center renovation, and the building committee is excited to share more details soon. We have some creative solutions to ensure our youth ministry continues to thrive and this key space can be used to its full potential.

If you'd like an opportunity to learn more about the Master Plan, there will be a discussion panel/Q&A session on Wednesday, February 19 at 7:00 pm in Room 220. Representatives from the capital campaign, facilities, and finance committees will be available to answer your questions.
