A. Paul is thankful for their steadfastness

1 Thessalonians 2:13 - "And we also thank God constantly for this, that when you received the word of God, which you heard from us, you accepted it not as the word of men but as what it really is, the word of God, which is at work in you believers."

B. Paul is thankful for their "acceptance" of God's word

- Acceptance – Welcoming

1 Thessalonians 3:8 - "For now we live, if you are standing fast in the Lord."

C. Paul is thankful for the effect of the Thessalonians

- Their faith produced thanksgiving and joy in Paul

D. Paul's response to this thankfulness was PRAYER
