#### ABRAHAM – STAR WITNESS

Romans 4:1 - "What then shall we say was gained by Abraham, our forefather according to the flesh?"

- A. Abraham was the Father of the Jewish people
- B. Abraham is significant in Judaism, Islam and Christianity
- C. Abraham shows that God's plan has ALWAYS been the same

#### II. JEWISH BELIEF ABOUT ABRAHAM

Romans 4:2 - "For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not before God."

A. Jews believed Abraham was justified by his works

#### III. SCRIPTURES TEACHING ON ABRAHAM

Romans 4:3 - "For what does the Scripture say? 'Abraham believed God, and it was counted to him as righteousness.'"

A. Abraham's faith not his works or obedience counted

### Genesis 15

- B. God's covenant was not contingent upon Abraham
- C. Abraham did NOTHING
- D. What did Abraham believe?
  - 1. Not in God's existence or reliability
  - 2. Abraham believed God was powerful to keep His promise

#### IV. "COUNTED"

- A. Financial term that refers to crediting
- B. God's credit is the righteousness that we lack

Romans 4:4-5 - "Now to the one who works, his wages are not counted as a gift but as his due. ⁵ And to the one who does not work but believes in him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is counted as righteousness..."

- C. If we work for our salvation...then God is in debt to us
- D. If we don't work...then we must believe in another
- E. Works based faith undervalues our sin and overvalues our ability
- F. In our inability we must have faith in God!
