ROMANS 8:31-39

I. GOD IS FOR US

Romans 8:31-32 - "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?"³² He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?"

A. God is for us

- God will give us all that we need

II. WHO CAN BE AGAINST US?

Romans 8:33-36 - "Who shall bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies.³⁴ Who is to condemn? Christ Jesus is the one who died—more than that, who was raised—who is at the right hand of God, who indeed is interceding for us.³⁵ Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or danger, or sword?³⁶ As it is written, 'For your sake we are being killed all the day long; we are regarded as sheep to be slaughtered.'"

A. Who Can Charge Believers?

- Initial answer: It is God who justifies

B. Who Can Condemn Believers?

- Initial answer: Jesus is interceding

C. Who can Separate Believers?

- Initial answer: No one

III. CONFIDENCE IN CHRIST

Romans 8:37-39 - "No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us.³⁸ For I am sure that neither death nor life, nor angels nor rulers, nor things present nor things to come, nor powers,³⁹ nor height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord."

A. We are conquerors through Christ

B. We are inseparable from the love of God

COMMUNITY GROUP DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What did you think about the message this week? What stood out to you or challenged your thinking?
2. Have you ever been concerned about your eternal security? Where was your focus when you were concerned? Where does Paul point our focus when talking about eternal security in verse 31?
3. Verse 32 tells us that God will give us “all things.” How has God provided for you through hard times in your spiritual walk? How has this given you confidence in your relationship with God?
4. Paul asked many rhetorical questions that can help us to understand our security in Christ. Which rhetorical question comforts you the most? Why?
5. Read Revelation 12:10. Who brings spiritual charges against believers? According to Romans, why won’t these charges stand?
6. Eternal security is important in the life of the believer. How have verses like v.39 helped you to have confidence in your spiritual walk?
7. Spend time in prayer thanking God for His love that holds onto our salvation.
