**Music notes:** The first Sunday of Advent is the very beginning of a new Christian year. The prelude today is J.S. Bach's (1685-1750) arrangement of Philipp Nicolai's text inspired by the Parable of the Ten Virgins (Matthew 25:1-13). Read the English version of this hymn in our hymnal at number 720 - "Wake, Awake, for Night is Flying." J.G. Walther's (1684-1748) Toccata in C Minor rounds out the service by connecting Advent 1 back to Christ the King Sunday and reminding us as we wait and watch that it's not time for Christmas yet.



"Canticle of the Turning" is a contemporary paraphrase of Mary's words in Luke 1:46-55, which echo earlier prophetic songs from the Old Testament. The hymn uses an Irish folk song for an upbeat, lively setting of Mary's song, full of hope and determination.

We'll be learning this song together in each week of our worship through this season of Advent.
