Walk the Stations of The Cross

Sarasota's Historic Good Friday Pilgrimage



This Good Friday, March 29th, is the 23rd year Sarasota will observe the worldwide STATIONS of the Cross tradition. What began in mid-15th century Jerusalem is now observed in over 200 nations, especially on Good Friday of Holy Week.

In past years, the procession was confined to the north sidewalk of Main Street. Since 2011, the Sarasota Police Department escort has facilitated the procession so that pilgrims can now walk down the center of Main Street. In 2023, nearly 1,000 pilgrims participated including our

Everyone is invited to Walk Your Faith this Holy Week by experiencing "The Way" or "STATIONS of the Cross" on March 29. Twenty-six Ministers of fourteen Denominations will take part in this event including our Pastor Linda. With six denominational Deans/Principals participating, over 100 congregations are represented. The procession will stop for worship

and prayer at each of the 14 STATIONS. The STATIONS of the Cross journey offers an opportunity to reflect on the different moments of Christ's passion journey. A service booklet sharing the acts of worship for each STATION will be distributed to all pilgrims.

The pilgrimage begins to gather at 7 a.m. and starts at 7:20 a.m. in front of the Regal Hollywood movie theater on Main Street. For those



who would like to park at the final station (Church of the Redeemer at 222 S. Palm Ave.), Siesta Trolley will transport pilgrims to Regal Hollywood from Redeemer starting at 6 a.m.

Pilgrims will reach the final STATION, Church of the Redeemer, at about 8:30 a.m. At that time, all pilgrims are invited to attend a brief Morning Prayer Service inside the church.

Come observe Christ's passion on the day the world celebrates it.

Over the last year, 14 new churches partnered with Zoe Empowers in the Florida United Methodist Conference, and many other churches have been involved in many different ways.

United Methodist Committee on Relief

March 10th is UMCOR Sunday. This Special Sunday is a denomination-wide celebration designed to raise awareness and support for the ministry of The United Methodist Committee on Relief. The UMCOR donations underwrites UMCOR's administrative costs to ensure 100% of gifts given for humanitarian response and recovery go directly to communities in need. These gifts ensure UMCOR can respond swiftly to disasters around the world and represent hope and healing to those most vulnerable. Gifts can be made online, or by check to Trinity UMC and note "UMCOR".

UMCOR, provides hope for communities and individuals whose lives have been upset by war, storms or other crises. This ministry is achieved exclusively through your generosity. Last year, your generosity delivered **\$1.7 million** towards these ministries:

□ International Disaster Response efforts provide assistance following natural or human-caused
disasters outside of the United States. Typical emergency response efforts include the distribution of
food, hygiene supplies and facilities, nonfood items, psychosocial support and shelter.
□ U.S. Disaster Response works with annual conferences in the United States to alleviate suffering
caused by disasters that strike within the United States and its territories. In partnership with confer-
ence level disaster response coordinators, UMCOR journeys with affected communities throughout
a disaster's cycle.
□ Global Migration provides relief and recovery in the form of food aid, basic necessities, and legal

□ Relief Supplies UMCOR Sager Brown Depot and affiliate warehouses within the UM Relief Sup-
ply Network collect relief supplies that are assembled by United Methodist volunteers for distribution
in the United States and its territories in response to disasters.

UMCOR's goal is to assist vulnerable people affected by crisis or chronic need without regard to their nationality, race, religion or status. We believe all people have God-given worth and dignity. One of the wonderful aspects of the connectional nature of The United Methodist Church is that we can do so much more together than we ever could do on our own. Because of you – UMCOR and its partners serve as witnesses to God's love for all.

Stewardship and Finance

Dear Trinity Members and Friends,

We are pleased to report the results of our pledge commitment campaign. We now have 72 households committed to give financially \$266,640 to the operating budget. This is an increase of households pledging from 60 in 2023 to 72 which is exciting! Thank you for your faithful generosity.

Our projected budget for 2024 of \$405,487 has not increased from last year. Each year we have additional income due to unpledged giving and loose plate offerings that we cannot predict. Last year we did have a shortfall in meeting expenses that we were able to overcome due to receiving federal grants. Unfortunately, this year these grants will not be available so we are anticipating a shortfall of approximately \$70,000. We can assure you that the staff and leadership of the church have reduced expenses and spending where possible, yet increases in fixed expenses out of our control such as insurance premiums and utilities have risen.

The ministries of Trinity UMC make a difference in God's Kingdom here in Sarasota. Please prayerfully consider an increase to your pledge or a second mile-offering gift. If you have not pledged yet it is not too late! Each one of you is an important part of God's work as we go forward into the future. We also would ask you to consider making Trinity UMC part of your estate planning or will. Information on how to do this will be coming in the near future.
