

Inhabit the Garden Centering Prayer Group

Every Friday morning we gather at 8:30 AM in the Garden of Hope. Each person brings a folding chair and we form a circle, finding the shade. Some of us come a bit early to catch up. Each person is vital to the circle because "you can't have a group meditation without a group" as a dear friend used to remind me. At 8:30 we read the four guidelines, pray the prayer of St Francis, join in a simple chant, then practice twenty minutes of Centering Prayer. In our shared leadership, one person reads our lectio passage from scripture, slowly, twice, and then we are given the opportunity to respond to three questions that flow out of the classical moments of lectio divina.



Silence is our friend throughout. It is not unusual for us to be surrounded by sounds of birds chirping, automobiles, motor cycles, children arriving for the church preschool. A couple weeks ago, one friend commented after our session that there had been a mockingbird perched on the overlooking cross and that he had counted 78 different songs from that bird. I thank the Holy Spirit that we valued the silence enough that he could hear and count each distinctive sound. In our shared silence we worship God in the beauty and diversity of holiness!

There is always more room in the circle. You will be warmly welcomed!
