

Saturday 22 February 9 AM to Noon

He was born the grandson of slaves. Thurman became a "spiritual foundation" for the Civil Rights movement. He inspired many, including Martin Luther King, Jr. He was the first Black American invited to meet Mahatma Gandhi. Thurman accepted Gandhi's challenge to translate his principles of non-violence into his African American experience.

Our morning will include learning about his life and ongoing significance. We will use his voice to lead us in praying in silence, interacting with a sample of his meditations.

Thurman writes: "Don't ask what the world needs. Ask what makes you come alive and go do it. Because what the world needs is people who have come alive."

I am glad I only have two knees because I am not doing this again! I look forward to be back in person with all of you in worship in February. I am very appreciative of everyone who works so hard each week to make online worship possible for those who can't be there. It is a wonderful ministry we provide that I enjoyed while I was out.

The time away has reminded me of a couple important aspects of the faith journey that we travel together.

1. <u>We are all part of a team</u>. Each of us has a role in God's team. We are not effective alone. I am so grateful for everyone who helped in extra ways while I was out - to preach, make visits, lead groups or many other aspects of ministry. Our team is always at work, but time away highlighted the importance of all of us working together to bring glory to God's kingdom. The success of God's team is not in one person, but in the whole of a community focused on God's word at work in the world. Each of you is an important part of God's team here at Trinity!

Do YOU HAVE IDEAS?


Do you believe in the importance of the church's involvement in our community?


Registration is online.

Creation Care Ministry



The **United Methodist Social Principles** as adopted by the General Council in 2024, has been published. The Social Principles serve as the United Methodist Church's official summary of stated convictions on social issues of the day. First adopted by the 1972 General Conference, the Social Principles document stands in the Wesleyan tradition of forthright moral witness and ethical action. I was especially interested in the Creation Care portion of the Social Principles (5 pages of the 43 total). Please allow me to share with you a few of the passages regarding **COMMUNITY OF ALL CREATION.**

We affirm our sacred calling to be responsible stewards and to lovingly tend all that God has wrought. We recognize the inherent worth of God's creation, celebrate earth's abundance and diversity, and, along with the entirety of the cosmos, give praise to its Creator. We recognize we are interconnected members of complex ecosystems, intricate webs of life, all of which have their origins in God's gracious act of creation.

CREATION IN PERIL We acknowledge that unsustainable human activities have placed the entirety of God's creation in peril. Overconsumption, shortsighted policies, poor management of natural resources, and other unsustainable practices have severely impacted the fragile, natural ecosystems on which all of life depends. Too often, humankind has treated the rest of the created world as if it were disposable and allowed the destruction of other living organisms and their natural habitats to go unchecked.

Climate Change Global warming is already creating extreme conditions that threaten the entirety of life on earth. Over industrialization, widespread deforestation, and overreliance on fossil fuels are but some of the human activities that have contributed to the buildup of greenhouse gases such as carbon dioxide, methane, and nitrous oxide in the earth's atmosphere. A sharp upsurge in greenhouse gases over past decades already has resulted in a steady rise in sea levels, growing acidification of the world's oceans, increased droughts and famines, and the intensification of extreme weather events. Climate scientists warn that the window of opportunity for reversing the negative effects of global warming and climate change is rapidly closing. Without concerted action by individuals, <u>churches</u>, communities, shareholders, businesses, governments, and international organizations, the negative effects will become irreversible.

STEWARDSHIP OF CREATION In Genesis 1, we read that God declares creation good (Gen. 1:4, 10, 12, 18, 25, 31), and we read in Genesis 2 that God "took the human and settled him in the garden of Eden to farm it and to take care of it" (Gen. 2:15). The goodness of God's creation, and the value given to every part of it, call people to respect, protect, and care for the creation and all interrelated aspects of it.
