Bread for the World

Expanding Our Embrace With "Offering of Letters"

Since 2020 Trinity UMC has held a monthly food drive to support the Food Pantry at Church of the Palms and Remnant Café. Our congregation along with many neighbors have been consistently generous with donations of food, clothing, and money.

This Lent the Church Council unanimously agreed to expand our embrace by partnering with other churches in our community and nationally in participating in the 'Offering of Letters' organized by Bread for the World (www.bread.org). This is new for Trinity.

Bread for the World is an ecumenical, non-partisan Justice Ministry. Just as our monthly food drive shows mercy to others, advocacy and justice ministry is an important part of our Christian witness as followers of Jesus. The 'Offering of Letters' is an opportunity for us to write letters to our local Representatives and Senators who have the power to impact policies and programs that can end hunger.

This year "Nourish Our Future" is our Campaign to End Childhood Hunger. We will provide information and sample letters about the legislative priorities we will pursue. There will be an opportunity after worship on Sunday 16 March to write personal letters. You may also write letters on your own. The next Sunday 23 March we will dedicate those letters as part of morning worship. Our letters will be combined with letters from other churches in our community and will be hand delivered to the local offices of our Representatives and mailed to our Senators. We have set a community goal of 500 letters.

Pastor's Page

Have you seen the signs of spring renewal all around? This week I had three days of robins in the yard as they passed through. I love robins and look for them every year, as they are my sign of hope for spring. I also see new growth beginning on the trees (sorry allergy sufferers). Another sure sign is my dog shedding his winter coat. As I brush and brush out handfuls of brown fur, I think about how nature works together so well. I know that many of the bird nests around the parsonage are full of discarded brown fur safely cradling new eggs or baby birds!

Spring is also the time of Lent, a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday, March 5th and ends on Holy Saturday before Easter April 19th. Just as creation around us is preparing for spring and summer, Lent is a time in which we prepare our hearts and spiritual souls for a renewal with Jesus at Easter. Any focus each of us may make on intentional steps of getting our heart and mind in a closer walk with our Lord makes the Easter celebration more joyous! We realize the need for Jesus in our life and that the resurrection is the true symbol of new life for us all.

So I urge each of you to think about something you can do from now until Easter to draw closer in your relationship with Jesus. Do you abstain from something that pulls you away from Jesus time (less TV, computer, phone time, gossip, spending); do you add something to encourage new habits beyond Easter (prayer time, reading scripture daily, devotion reading of a new book, a prayer walk outdoors); do you practice Jesus' kindness toward others with more intention and thought? (see note on this page I asked Evelyn to share). Or maybe your Lent practice is giving up something like chocolate or soda as a daily reminder to think about Jesus during the day (when you feel the urge you think about Jesus' gift of hope for you).

My Lent sermon series will be From Wilderness to Glory as I look at the stories and words of Jesus through his ministry. It is my prayer for all of us that we are open to renewal and new life through Jesus in the coming weeks of Lent!




Persis Circle once again gathered together and assembled rose bud vases with notes and delivered to the teachers and staff of Phillippi Shores Elementary School on Valentines day.
