

Pastor's Page

Thank you for your heart for others Trinity! At our recent Charge Conference I shared the Pastor's Report reflecting on the year since the last conference in 2024. I looked back at the last year in which your heart and generosity for sharing Jesus with others was so evident. Thank you for being a church that truly cares!

Our DS, Rev. Dr. Debbie Allen who presided at our meeting talked about the importance of the connection between United Methodist churches being in ministry together. We have one such opportunity right now. I have been contacted by Rev. Beth Bostrom who is the pastor at First United Methodist Church of Palmetto. Beth was connected to our church for a short time and also preached for me when I was out before being appointed to this church. First Palmetto UMC has a Food Pantry that typically served 225-250 families every Tuesday. Due to recent financial stress in families that number has climbed to 300 families. She is anticipating that this need will only continue to grow in the immediate future. In addition to an increased need, USDA funding has been cut and the sources she has had for food deliveries have been reduced so there is less food available for their Food Pantry. She is asking for assistance in helping these families.

For our November mission I would ask that we collect **canned goods (meat, vegetables, fruit, soup)** to help with this immediate need. If you would like to help, put your canned goods on the Mission collection table in Haley Hall.



We will continue to have our monthly food drive to help the local food pantry at Church of the Palms and all hygiene items will go to Remnant House.

November is truly a time to remember our blessings and pass them on!

Trinity Preschool Receives Grant for Garden

In April, Marsha Mayers received a grant from the Florida Delta Kappa Gamma Educational Foundation to start a garden for Trinity Preschool. The planting began with Seminole pumpkin seeds in July, and has progressed to the planting of Everglades tomatoes, radishes, native cucumbers, wild strawberries, basil, oregano, rosemary, marigolds, zinnias, nasturtium, mint, and native milkweed in raised beds along the south side of the playground. Preschoolers love watering the plants with their spray bottles. The teachers have pitched in daily to keep plants watered and covered with netting to protect them plants from neighborhood critters.

"The World" thanks you for your enthusiastic support of World Communion Sunday. Special thanks go to each of you who participated in our Bread for the World Offering of Letters. These letters were addressed to our elected leaders asking that they support robust funding for proven global nutrition and food aid programs to especially respond to areas of famine and severe hunger such as Gaza, Sudan, and Haiti. You generously by signing 42 letters. We mailed the ones to Senators Scott and Moody. On Friday 17 October we hand delivered 15 letters to the office of Rep Greg Steube. We were graciously received by the District Director Dana Goulet. She had some positive familiarity of the justice ministry of Bread for the World. She assured us that the Staff will include the content of these letters as they formulate their legislative agenda.

We also spoke about the difficulties of the current government shutdown. We shared Bread's prayerful concern

for all those going without pay and federal workers who are losing or who have already lost their jobs. We hold in prayer those who are at imminent risk of losing WIC and SNAP benefits. And we assured Ms Goulet that we are praying for all our elected leaders who are tasked with creating a federal budget. As we left Ms Goulet thanked us for our visit and expressed appreciation for the ecumenical and non-partisan emphasis of Bread for the World.

It is with gratitude that our circle gathers each Friday morning from 8:30 to 9:30 AM in the Garden of Hope.It "feels" like we are officially in Fall so our circle has more shape these weeks. Last Friday (October 24) eleven of us joined the circle including two first timers. We are grateful for the on-going attraction of the Spirit. We rely on her loving presence.

Father Keating teaches us that our focus in our shared silence is "the Living Christ." Through scripture and service we learn of Christ's expression of the deep love of God by profound humility. Jesus "did not count equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave." (Philippians 2:6-7) Because he was nothing but love, Jesus willingly, even joyfully, became a nobody, fully surrendered.

Personally, I find this one thing to say theologically, but quite another to practice in silence and living. I have not successfully resigned from the instinct to be someone, to be recognized, to be competent, to achieve. I don't think there is anything wrong with any of those, but on-going, daily practice of Centering Prayer makes me aware of how out of proportion and exaggerated those instincts can and do become. I recently read, "The addiction to 'identity' seems the deepest of the unconscious programming, so profoundly hidden that it long escapes even attentive reflection."

That may seem a bit deep, and it is. So to simplify, praying in silence is a way of following Christ humbly accepting becoming a nobody so that by the grace of God we can be transformed into a "YESBODY." After all, "In Jesus Christ every one of God's promises is a YES." (2 Corinthians 1:19)

Hey Meta...Look and Describe



During a Family Reunion trip to North Carolina, our Phyllis Pritchett was interviewed by the local newspaper. Here is the article (in part):

Hey Meta...Look and Describe! This is a common command native Phyllis Pritchett says throughout her day and it has improved her life.

Over 15 years ago, Pritchett was diagnosed with retinitis pigmentosa, an eye disease that causes progressive vision loss. She initially lost her peripheral vision and often described her sight as looking through two straws. Now her vision is 95% gone.

To help adapt to her vision loss, Pritchett became acquainted with a low vision company in her community of Sarasota Florida.

Nearly a year ago, she learned of Ray-Ban Meta Al integrated glasses and was immediately interest.

After a demonstration and training session in her home where she learned she could read her mail, text friends, and answer phone calls, all through her glasses, she decided to purchase a pair.

The trainer told me to open my refrigerator and ask Meta to find the ham salad, and I was given the response "second shelf on left side." That's what sold me on the glasses right then and there," said Pritchett.

She shared additional examples that impressed her. Needing a find a red shirt in her closet, Pritchett asked Meta to look and find the red shirt. Meta quickly responded that it was on the second hanger on the left. During a visit to Walmart with a friend, they were having difficulty finding the wood glue, so she decided to try out her glasses. Again Meta's prompt response was that it was on the bottom shelf on the right.

Pritchett made it clear that the glasses don't improve her vison. Their use is to help her navigate her surroundings. And while AI integrated glasses can be purchased online, she opted to buy directly from the manufacturer at the suggestion of her eye doctor. By going this round, she received hands-on Training and one year of support. Although this was an additional cost, Pritchett said it was beyond worth it.

The glasses have a six hour run time and take approximately 20 minutes to charge. Charging occurs in the case. Price for the glasses range from \$300 to \$500.

Phyllis's favorite thing about her Ray-Ban Meta glasses? "I can read my mail. I can read a book or have a book read to me. They help me to be independent and when you live alone, you need all the help you can get."

Since owning her smart glasses, she has demonstrated them to friends and neighbors and has assisted four people in getting a pair. She said jokingly that she hasn't received a commission check, but that it's OK, because helping people is what it's all about.
