Dear Trinity Family,

In worship on January 25th I announced that I have made the decision to retire this year at Annual Conference. I have had blessed careers first as a psychotherapist for 16 years and 25 years as a United Methodist minister, but it is time to move into the next chapter of my life called retired! I want to reassure you that your Staff Parish Committee has already had a meeting with the District Superintendent, Rev. Dr. Debbie Allen, to discuss a future clergy appointment. In addition, Ian Bland (SPRC chair) and I have met with her to continue this conversation. I am confident that Rev. Allen will be a strong advocate for Trinity and the needs of the church moving forward.

In case you aren't familiar with the United Methodist appointment process let me share how new clergy are selected. After consultation with the SPRC committee (this has happened), the Cabinet (all DS's in conference and the Bishop) will meet to discuss the churches and clergy that will be changing this year. The first of these meetings will happen the first week of February. I can tell you this is a time of much prayer and listening for the guidance of the Holy Spirit as they work to match the best minister's gifts with the needs of a church. This is a process that will continue through February and March.

Announcement Sunday will be April 19th in which Trinity will find out who their new pastor will be. This pastor will start the first Sunday in July. There will be conversations to assist in the transition.

My last Sunday will be June 7th and I will move to Orlando soon after so the trustees can work to get the parsonage ready for your new minister. I am currently remodeling my family home so it will be ready to move in! I will be traveling back to Kenya 6/16-26 to see the Zoe family groups with my last official day being June 30th.

On other news, Karen Remfrey our church administrator has also decided to retire. Her last Sunday will be March 1st. The good news is Karen will still be a member of Trinity and you will continue to see her often! The SPRC committee will begin the hiring process in the near future. Margie Aukland who has been volunteering in the office, has agreed to help out until our new administrator is hired.

Friends, change can be hard, but it can also be transforming. I am excited for the plans God has for Trinity in the future and sometimes change although hard, opens the doors to opportunities we can't even see now. Faith and trust go hand in hand my friends!! I am still here for 4 more months so we will continue to worship, praise God and grow together.



3/1 – I Am The Light Of the World


3/8 – I am the Door of the Sheep



Inhabit the Garden



Every Friday morning, our Centering Prayer Group gathers at 8:30 AM with the shared purpose “to consent to God’s presence and action within” by praying in silence, which is God’s original language. Following the shared silence we reverence the “priesthood of all believers” through shared leadership by listening together to a passage of scripture with the opportunity to share how the Spirit is being revealed among and within us. Together we hold this space with open hearts by affirming that it is ok for silence to have the first and the last word. The Spirit often shows up in surprising ways, sometimes with a jolt, often with much tenderness. We usually depart with a “word” for the week. We also learn not to take ourselves too seriously!

Once a month we also convene an “Expand the Cell” Centering Prayer Group using portions from Julian of Norwich a medieval mystic who has much to teach us about the love of God. This group is in a Zoom environment. We gather on the second Wednesday

monthly at 2 PM. This past month I embarrassed myself. We were holding the silence together. I keep the time, but Christine noticed that on my screen I was slumped over, having nodded off. She came upstairs to waken me so we could continue. Our little group was very tolerant of my foibles. The little incident reminded me of one of my mentors in Centering Prayer. His name was Tom, and he was like a Johnny Appleseed of Centering Prayer, planting many groups many of which are still flourishing. The last several years of his life, I attended a group he led. On occasion our twenty minutes of silence would be extended for a while. When Tom roused to ring the concluding bell he would just say, “I think we got some bonus time with God.” That is still a word of encouragement to me. Silence is Bonus Time with God.—Rev. Stephen Hoffman

THE DANGER OF SILENCE

When we pray for others we are encouraged to be as specific as possible. We all are grateful when Karen sends us a Prayer Request with the name of a beloved church member in special need of prayer. We pray for them by name.

We have learned the names of **Renee Nicole Good and Alex Pretti**, both of whom have been killed by being shot by Agents for US Immigration and Customs Enforcement in Minneapolis. We mourn their death and grieve with their loved ones and family by praying for them by name.

January 19 was our observation of the Birthday of Martin Luther King, Jr. Bishop Berlin used this occasion to write a piece titled "The Danger of Silence." He began by asking us the question, "When does our silence equal complicity?" Bishop Berlin recalled the words of Dr King on the occasion of the murder of four girls when a bomb was detonated on a Sunday morning at the 16th Street Baptist Church.

Bishop Berlin writes, "King observed the silence of citizens at the time who did not want to be involved in the struggle for civil rights. He condemned those who tolerated segregation and violence in exchange for civil order." This is very similar to the narrative being used to justify the fracturing of families and traumatizing of neighbors happening now under the guise of immigration enforcement to supposedly ensure public safety.

Bishop Berlin recalls recent events, "Last week lives were lost in Minnesota, and some have said they deserved it. **Think about who we are becoming when people see the death of a citizen of the United States who was stopped by ICE Agents as collateral damage and an acceptable loss for some greater good.**"



Here in Florida the violence against our immigrant neighbors is less obvious but no less fracturing and traumatic. Our neighbors are being detained, disappeared, and deported all with full cooperation of local sheriffs and FHP. It is every bit as dehumanizing and unjust as what is happening in Minnesota. Our laws are being perverted to deny due process. This is being done in secret not allowing family visits for those detained and access to legal advice is held to a minimum.

Bishop Berlin offers specific suggestions. "Rather than share with a few friends who agree with us, it is time to write repetitively to those who claim to lead us. We can show up at rallies (or prayer vigils, I might add). Those who have

the capacity to assemble peaceably must do so. We are called to move from observing to doing, to organize ourselves to speak to politicians and offer legal support." He observes that "Congress and the courts sit largely on the sidelines. The people of our nation must not."

I read what our Bishop writes. I read our Social Principles. I read actions our General Board of Church and Society endorse. What is heard locally is mostly silence. What I see locally is much tolerance for complicity.

I was grateful to attend the Church Council meeting on 20 January to represent Social Justice. I asked the question, "What are you willing to do?" I wait for a response.

There are local efforts underway to pray publicly. Every week some folks attend using walkers with limited mobility. There are efforts to provide food for families who have been fractured or are living in justifiable fear. My experience is that when I am with these neighbors is when I feel most Wesleyan. After all, John Wesley learned to embrace worshipping outside among all people.

From Bishop Tom Berlin

We are in a difficult season. Reports of harm, loss of life, and aggressive enforcement actions against immigrants and those who seek to accompany them have shaken many of us and raised deep questions about how we as Christians respond to fear and suffering. In the midst of this, I've felt called, as so many of you have, to do more.

That is why I want to personally invite you to join me on **Wednesday, February 25, 2026**, in Washington, D.C., for **Faithful Resistance: A Public Witness for Immigrant Justice.**

This will be a day of worship, prayer, and peaceful witness together with United Methodists and our ecumenical and interfaith partners, lifting a faithful call for the humane and compassionate treatment of immigrants.

For those able to attend in person, we will gather together as a conference at **9 a.m.** in front of **Capitol Hill United Methodist Church**, prior to the start of the event, to walk together.

I recognize that not everyone will be able to travel. You are encouraged to participate in whatever way is possible for you—by attending in person, by following the day online through the livestream (details forthcoming), or by organizing prayerful, simultaneous events in your local communities on the same day. Wherever you are, your faithful presence matters.
