Welcome to worship at Resurrection Lutheran Church!

Today, we celebrate God's work in our lives, receiving His Word and Sacraments that strengthens our relationship with Him and one another. By the blood of Christ, we are the household of God that He builds up by grace, through faith, and for service!

LESSONS AND LITURGY TODAY

Based on the original verdict for sin spoken by God over Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden ("you are dust and to dust you shall return"), ashes have been adopted by the Christian church as an emblem of our own sinful mortality. As we begin the 40-day period of Lent tonight, we are focusing together on Jesus' own death, for us. God did not spare His only Son but sent Him to our world to suffer, die, and rise again. Jesus' death was an absolute necessity to redeem us from our sin. Christ's death secures our forgiveness; without it, we would be eternally lost. Tonight, we wear the mark of human frailty and mortality together. But just as we are mindful of our sin, we also call to mind God's gift of Holy Baptism, where another crossed is traced over our foreheads to mark each of us "as one redeemed by Christ the crucified." We thank God for sending His only begotten Son for our salvation, that through the cross of Christ we are forgiven and have everlasting life!

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CALL TO REPENTANCE

Joel 2:12-19

(We are encouraged to return to the Lord our God, for He is Compassionate.)

"Yet even now," declares the LORD, "return to Me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning.; and rend your heart and not your garments."

Return to the LORD your God, for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love; and He

relents over disaster. Who knows whether He will not turn and relent, and leave a blessing behind Him, a grain offering and a drink offering for the LORD your God? Blow the trumpet in Zion; consecrate a fast, call a solemn assembly; gather the people. Consecrate the congregation;

assemble the elders; gather the children, even nursing infants.

Let the bridegroom leave his room and the bride her chamber. Between the vestibule and the altar let the priests, the ministers of the LORD, weep and say, "Spare Your people, O LORD, and make not Your heritage a reproach, a byword among the nations. ♦ Confession of Sins

P Brothers and sisters:

God created us to experience joy in communion with Him, to love all humanity, and to live in harmony with all His creation.

But sin separates us from God, our neighbors, and creation, and so we do not enjoy the life our Creator intended for us.

Also, by our sin we grieve our Father who does not desire us to come under His judgment, but to turn to Him and live.

As disciples of the Lord Jesus Christ we are called to struggle against everything that leads us away from God and neighbor.

Repentance, fasting, prayer and works of love - the discipline of Lent - help us to wage our spiritual warfare.

I invite you, therefore, to commit yourselves to this struggle and confess your sins, asking our Father for strength to persevere in your Lenten discipline.

Silence for reflection and self-examination

P Most Holy and Merciful Father:

- C We confess to You and to one another, and to the whole communion of saints in Heaven and on earth, that we have sinned by our own fault in thought, word and deed: by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

- P For false judgments, for uncharitable thoughts toward our neighbors, and for our prejudice and contempt toward those who differ from us,

EPISTLE

II Corinthians 5:20b-6:10

(In Christ we receive the Righteousness of God.)

We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God.

For our sake He made Him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in Him we might become the righteousness of God.

Working together with Him, then, we appeal to you not to receive the grace of God in vain. For He says, "In a favorable time I listened to you, and in a day of salvation I have helped you." Behold, now is the favorable time; behold, now is the day of salvation.

We put no obstacle in anyone's way, so that no fault may be found with our ministry,

but as servants of God we commend ourselves in every way: by great endurance, in afflictions, hardships, calamities, beatings, imprisonments, riots, labors, sleepless nights, hunger; by purity, knowledge, patience, kindness, the Holy Spirit, genuine love; by truthful speech, and the Power of God; with the weapons of righteousness for the right hand and for the left; through honor and dishonor, through slander and praise.
