Topic: *Doing God's Work God's Way*

Text: 2 Samuel 6

### Getting Started

- What's the most impactful worship experience you've ever had?
  - Have you ever been excited about doing something good or "for God", but it didn't go the way you expected?
- 

### Sermon Discussion

- What does it look like today to "bring God to the center" of your life or home?
- How can good spiritual desires fade or get crowded out during busy seasons of life (career, parenting, responsibilities)?
- How can we make sure our worship and service are shaped by God's Word rather than just what feels right?
- How can familiarity with church or spiritual things sometimes make us too casual with God?
- Have you ever pulled back from God because something painful or confusing happened?
- What tends to delay or derail your worship—discouragement, busyness, doubt, guilt?
- What helps you re-engage with God after disappointment or fear?
- David worshiped with visible joy and humility. What keeps adults our age from expressing joy in worship?
- How could you participate more fully or joyfully in worship—mentally, emotionally, or physically?
- Why is gathered worship essential and not just optional for mature faith?
- Read Romans 12:1. What are some ways that we can continue worshipping God outside of just Sunday gatherings?
