



## Tri-Village Sermon Discussion Questions

Topic: *We Worship Together*

Text: *Hebrews 10:23-25*

Service Date: May 17, 2026

Note: The questions are only a starting point for discussion. Don't hesitate to modify, adapt, or highlight only specific ones to fit your group and/or personal study.

### Getting Started

- On Sunday, Paul asked why we came to church today. What are some reasons you come to church?
- This week we talked about worshipping together. Have you ever participated in a particularly memorable worship experience that impacted you in a significant way? What were some of the elements that made it so moving/memorable?

### Sermon Discussion

- Worship means to “give value to.” What are some ways we can give value to God outside of singing?
- A sense of awe and reverence is the first ingredient of worship. What are some of things that can keep us from having that sense in our worship?
- The second key ingredient of worship is joy. People express their joy in worship in different ways. How do you show joy in your worship?
- What kind of church did you grow up in: hands raised or hands in pockets? How do you think that has affected how you worship today? If you did not grow up in a church, do you have a preferred worship style? Why is that your preference?
- When we attend a worship service, we should be there to glorify God. Yet it's easy to get into the habit of evaluating a worship service like it's a performance. What does the habit reveal about our mindset and focus?
- Worship is our coming together not to please each other; not to evaluate all the different styles of worship, and not to evaluate every participant, but to glorify God and show our appreciation to Him for Who He is and what He has done for us. Is this how you typically think of worship? If not, how can this change in mindset change how we participate in a worship service?

- Read Hebrews 10:23-25. We also worship together to encourage one another. How have you been encouraged through worshipping together in the past? Where do you need encouragement today?
- Genuine worship can compel and attract others and become a testimony to non-Christians. What does our worship (or lack thereof) communicate to non-believers about our love of God? Is your worship an accurate reflection of your heart?
- On Sunday, Paul asked how we prepare for the worship service each week. Do you have a routine to prepare your heart and mind for worship? How do you think that can affect how we approach worship during and after the service?
- Do you believe that regularly attending a worship service is important? Have you ever noticed a difference in how you approach your week if you miss a Sunday service?
- On Sunday, Paul said there is no such thing as an “unchurched” Christian in the Bible. Yet there is a growing number of believers who do not think it’s important to worship as part of a church body. What do we miss out on by avoiding congregational worship, and why is a church body so important to our relationship with Jesus?

### **This Week’s Action Response**

- Worship is about participation—it’s not a spectator sport! Often, we can lose the focus of worship if we spectate rather than participate. This week, consider whether your worship is truly a reflection of your love for God. If those two do not align, consider ways that you can move toward a genuine worship that glorifies God and encourages others.
