



## Tri-Village Sermon Discussion Questions

Topic: *We Connect Together*

Text: *Acts 2:42-47*

Service Date: May 31, 2026

Note: The questions are only a starting point for discussion. Don't hesitate to modify, adapt, or highlight only specific ones to fit your group and/or personal study.

### Getting Started

- What's the best community you have ever been a part of? What makes a community great in your eyes?
- 

### Sermon Discussion

- What do you think a church should be most known for today, and why?
- The message pointed out that people are more technologically connected than ever, yet often feel isolated. Why do you think loneliness is still so common?
- Read Acts 2:42–47 together. Which characteristic of the early church stands out most to you personally?
- The sermon said, “The early church was not built merely on attendance, but on relationships.” What is the difference between attending church and truly belonging to a church community?
- On Sunday, Paul discussed how families, neighborhoods, and churches have changed over time. What changes in culture do you think make meaningful connection harder today?
- Why do you think spiritual growth is difficult without consistent engagement with Scripture? What has helped you stay connected to God's Word?
- The Greek word “koinonia” was described as deep fellowship and shared life together. What do healthy Christian friendships look like in practice?
- Paul asked, “Who has refrigerator rights in your life?” Who are the people you trust deeply enough to be honest and vulnerable with?
- Jesus had different levels of relationships — close friends, disciples, and larger crowds. What does that teach us about healthy expectations for friendships and community?
- Sunday's message emphasized the importance of smaller groups for prayer, support, and involvement. How have small groups or close Christian friendships impacted your faith

journey?

- Read Galatians 6:2. What does it practically look like to “carry each other’s burdens” in a church community?
- The sermon compared Christians to “marbles” or “grapes.” Which image best describes your current connection to church life, and why?
- On Sunday, Paul encouraged having an “attitude of inclusion.” What are practical ways we can help new or less-connected people feel welcomed and valued?
- Fred Craddock’s father eventually realized he was wrong about the church because of the love shown to him. When have you personally experienced the church caring for you in a meaningful way?
