Topic: *What Happens When I Die?*

Text(s): 2 Corinthians 4:16-5:10

Note: The questions are only a starting point for discussion. Don't hesitate to modify, adapt, or highlight only specific ones to fit your group and/or personal study.

Getting Started

- If you had to pick one phrase or Bible verse that would be your legacy, what would it be?

Sermon Discussion

- Have you ever lost someone who was close to you? How did it impact your life?
- Why do you think death is difficult to discuss (both for Christians and non-Christians)?
- It's been said that for the Christian death is only the beginning of life since a believer will ultimately be spending it with Jesus in Heaven. How does knowing this life isn't where we will spend eternity change how you see your home, car, money/investments, and other possessions?
- Read 2 Corinthians 4:16-18. How do you see God renewing you internally or spiritually every day?
- After reflecting upon 2 Corinthians 4:16-18, was there ever a major struggle in your life where you felt like giving up? How do you find encouragement through placing your eyes on what is unseen instead of what is seen (as it refers to Christ and our faith in verse 18)?
- Our answer to "What happens when I die?" directly affects our attitude; what we believe about the future impacts our present. If you're a Christian, do you believe this to be true for you today? Why or why not?

- What do you think Heaven will be like? Is there any reason a person wouldn't want to go to Heaven?
- We don't know most of what will happen after we die, but we can have certainty that Jesus is preparing a place for those who are faithful to Him. In thinking about Heaven, what is your biggest hope for eternity?
- What is one thing you can do this week to help others focus on eternity and Jesus more?
- If your group has time, take a moment to read Revelation 21 and be reminded of what awaits believers.
