



Tri-Village Sermon Discussion Questions

Topic: *Death Over Life*

Service Date: March 24, 2024

Romans 3:9-30

Note: The questions are only a starting point for discussion. Don't hesitate to modify, adapt, or highlight only specific ones to fit your group and/or personal study.

Getting Started

- The sermon opened with the sentence, “We need to talk.” If you had a chance to talk to Jesus about anything, what would you most like to talk to Him about? What do you think would be His response to you?

Sermon Discussion

- Every person goes through a time when they face problems. In your life, what have been some big problems you've faced that you overcame? How'd you overcome them?
- How you ever made a big mistake and then had to “own up” to it? What was the process like?
- The sermon pointed out that all have sinned and fallen short of God's glory (Romans 3:23). It's a subject we tend to avoid. What are some tactics we use to gloss over sin in our life?
- Brian discussed how we are sometimes hard on ourselves regarding sin. Why are we so hard on ourselves when we believe Christ has forgiven us? Why do we have such a difficult time forgiving ourselves?
- Read Romans 3:9-23. What does this passage indicate about sin and the effects it can have on our lives?
- If every person has sinned, why is it so much easier to judge others for their mistakes instead of not them? Do you think individuals are naturally critical of the faults of others?

- Growing in our faith means learning to resist the devil and temptations that may appear. What are ways in which you've found are helpful for keeping your life pure and away from sin?
- In thinking about how Jesus has changed your life, where would you be today if it weren't for His forgiveness?
- How can you show the same type of forgiveness that God showed us to individuals in your life?
