


From the Pastor

Continuing the Challenge!

I love a good challenge. If you told me I couldn't do something, I was usually all the more motivated to do that very thing. For me, a challenge is a great way to see what you're capable of doing. How far can you go? How much can you push yourself? Where is your limit? Or, as I've often found, how much more than my limit can I actually achieve?

I have asked myself these questions many of times as I prepared for a run. When people ask me why I like to run so far, this is the answer I give. Challenging myself to do more than I thought I could do is exciting, encouraging, and motivating. To be clear, it's not easy. By definition then it wouldn't be a challenge!

Every time I've completed a race, I've still wanted to get back to my normal routine. Maybe the pace changed a bit, but I still wanted to keep running, and after some time, I'd sign up for another race.

As we've wrapped up the Red Letter Being Challenge, I find myself in a similar place as the running. This challenge has been a faster pace, and it hasn't always been easy. Yes, there were a few times I had to catch up on multiple days of reading! And some of the content, it pushed me to really reflect on my walk with Jesus.



At the same time, I'm excited, encouraged, and motivated to keep moving forward in my faith. It's this part especially that I hope is true for you, too. Just like running, there's another "race." (No, we're not jumping into another 40-day challeng!) Our pace might be a bit different for a while, but there are ways we can continue to grow in our faith both individually and collectively. The question is: how will you do that? How will you continue to move forward in your faith?

February's Outreach Thought: The Splash Zone

When I was in high school my family attend a Blue Man Group performance and we sat in the Splash Zone. That meant at the climax of the performance colorful slime was splashed onto us. Maybe that sounds like a miserable experience—a great way to ruin an outfit—and it would have been... except that we were provided with a poncho before we sat down.

The poncho meant the slime could do us no harm—wouldn't hurt any clothing or stick in anyone's hair. With the poncho in place, the slime literally rolled right off of us and turned what could have been a real mess into a fun experience.

As we engage those around us, we can often feel like we're in the splash zone. Maybe you worry about this: what's going to stick to you or tarnish you or harm you if you get too close to non-Christians? But remember how Jesus is described in Jude: The one who is able to present you unblemished before the Father (1:24). You are sealed as a child of God. Your identity and your eternity are secure in Him. That's your poncho! Whatever might be splashed onto you will roll right off.

All this to mean, you can receive any critique (of the Church or Jesus or Christians); you can meet any person wherever they are; you can engage any idea or belief with openness (not necessarily with full affirmation). It's all safe—it won't harm you. None of it will shake or impact who you are in Jesus even a little bit, so you can go where you need to go and engage whoever is before you for the sake of the Gospel. As you go into your various communities, be confident in your poncho and engage!
