

It is that time of year when we host our annual signature event, "The Color Pink" which will be held Wednesday, October 15 at 7 PM in the Brookland Baptist Conference Center. We ask that you join us on this Faith Journey where we pray a little louder, praise a little harder, dance a little longer, and shed tears of joy and gratitude as we Celebrate Life!!! Our theme for this year is "Grace: I Don't Look Like What I've Been Through!"

Join us for an inspiring evening with guest artist, singer and song writer, Crystal Aikin, winner of the inaugural season of "BET's Sunday Best". Crystal also received a recording contract with Verity Gospel, known as RCA Inspiration. She is known for her confident and laid-back approach. We are delighted to welcome her here to bless the masses.

The Brookland Foundation's Health and Wellness Program provides services and outreach to the uninsured and underinsured while promoting healthy lifestyles and well-being. As program director of the Health & Wellness Program, our committee and I work diligently with the Brookland Foundation to engage the community to promote healthy behaviors, reduce the risks of chronic diseases, improve health outcomes, and provide a sense of social support for those who are experiencing health challenges.

A major component of the program's work is dedicated to promoting the prevention and early detection of breast cancer and providing resources and support to breast cancer survivors, those who have been recently diagnosed, their family members, and caregivers. Our mission is to improve the lives of individuals by enhancing their spiritual, emotional, physical, social and economic well-being.

Here in the U.S., it is estimated that each year 240,000 cases of breast cancer are diagnosed in women and about 2,100 in men. In South Carolina, breast cancer is the most commonly diagnosed cancer among women and is second to lung cancer as the most common cause of cancer deaths. While African American women have a lower rate of getting breast cancer, they are more likely to die from breast cancer in comparison to white women.

While these statistics may be daunting, there is hope. Statistics reflect that when breast cancer is detected at an early stage, there is a 93 percent or higher survival rate in the first five years. Funds raised during the event will help us provide free mammogram vouchers for the uninsured and underinsured and support the operations of the Survivor's Circle Breast Cancer Support Group.

This inspiring event will be an evening to remember as we celebrate breast cancer survivors, hear remarkable testimonies of survivorship, pay tribute to those who fought valiantly, but lost the battle, and acknowledge the unwavering support of caregivers, family members, and friends. The Brookland Foundation, deeply committed to supporting our community, has taken a stand in the battle against breast cancer and we welcome you to support our efforts by attending the gala.







"The 1619 Project is an award-winning reframing of American history that places slavery and its continuing legacy at the center of our national narrative. The project offers a revealing origin story for the United States that helps explain the persistence of anti-Black racism and inequality in American life today, also the roots of so much of what makes the country unique," (The 1619 Project, 2023). The book is an expansion of the New York Times Magazine's work.

In 2020, Author Nikole Hannah-Jones won of the 2020 Pulitzer Prize for Commentary for her original 1619 Project essay in the *New York Times*. The essay has expanded to two books, a podcast, and a docuseries that discusses the history of slavery in the United States of America

Nikole Hannah-Jones is an award-winning investigative reporter who covers civil rights and racial injustice for The New York Times Magazine and the Knight Chair in Race and Journalism at Howard University where she is the founding director of the Center for Journalism & Democracy.

Her reporting has earned her the Pulitzer Prize, the MacArthur "Genius" Grant, the Knight Award for Public Service, the Peabody Award, two George Polk awards and the National Magazine Award three times. She is a Society of American Historians Fellow and a member of the Academy of Arts & Sciences.

Nikole started her journalism career covering the majority-black Durham Public Schools for The News & Observer in Raleigh, N.C. During her three years there, she wrote extensively on issues of race, class, school re-segregation and equity.






