FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR...

Have you ever been in a cave and experienced what darkness feels like? In all cave tours, the guide generally takes the group to a spot where the lights can be turned off, and the guides turns his or her flashlight off. It is pitch black. You can't even see your hand in front of your face. One professional cave mapper and rescuer recounts a story of what happened to a young boy he was involved in helping find. He said the boy went into a cave alone with only one light, and it quit working. The boy wandered around in the darkness, hitting his head on rocks until he was so frightened that he wet himself. He sat down on a rock and was there for twenty-four hours before he was found. They found him within a hundred yards of the entrance.

Caves are dangerous because of the darkness. But what happens when light invades that dark cavernous space? Light brings hope.

When I think of this type of darkness and the hope that light can bring, I think about Isaiah's prophecy about the coming Messiah and the hope he will bring. In Isaiah 9:2, 6 the prophet writes, "The people walking in darkness have seen a great light; a light has dawned on those living in the land of darkness...For unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given..."

Since the Garden of Eden, humanity has experienced the frightening despair of darkness, but God sent us His Son, the light of the world, to not only bring the curse of sin to an end, but to bring us hope. If you feel you are in a spiritual cave, look for the light of Christ. He brings hope. He brings healing. He brings joy. To help you see the light of Christ more clearly, our choir is presenting *Hope is Born* this Sunday at 10:00 AM. I "hope" you will be here and that you will find it a blessing as we point one another to our everlasting hope who is Jesus Christ.
