

2 Timothy 3:14-4:5

NRSV

A reading from the second letter of Paul to Timothy.

As for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in

Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work.

In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favorable or unfavorable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. Holy and gracious God: in your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all. He stretched out his arms upon the cross, and offered himself in obedience to your will, a perfect sacrifice for the whole world.

On the night he was handed over to suffering and death, our Lord Jesus Christ took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, and said, "Take, eat: this is my Body, which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

After supper he took the cup of wine; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said, "Drink this, all of you: this is my Blood of the New Covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me.

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

FEATURED MINISTRIES AT ST. ANDREW'S

There are so many ways St. Andreans reach out to our neighbors in need. Listed below are a few of our ongoing ministries. To learn more or to get involved, please email us at office@standrewsoregonhill.org!

- Our Laundry Ministry celebrates its 10th anniversary this year! This important ministry gives our unhoused neighbors the opportunity to wash their clothes. On alternate Wednesdays, volunteers meet unhoused folks at a local laundromat, providing them with quarters and detergent. Every quarter donated helps, and anyone who can give a couple of hours on a Wednesday to help out in person is very welcome!
- The Shelter Lunches ministry grew out of an invitation from a guest choir singer to join a group of churches who rotate packing lunches for local shelters. Two years later, St. Andreans and friends gather in the chapel on the second Saturday of every month to pack and deliver 115 lunches to nearby shelters! More packers and delivery drivers are always welcome, as are financial gifts which are used to purchase food.
- Our long-running Blessings Fence ministry began years ago with an Epiphanytide program to put warm, often hand-crafted, gloves, scarves, socks, and hats on our fence for anyone in need to take. The ministry has expanded to include jackets (new or very gently used), too! Yarn is available in the undercroft for our crafty parishioners to use to knit and crochet smaller items. We now put things out as soon as it starts to get cold, so your donations for winter 2025-2026 are already welcome. There's also a warm-weather version of the Blessings Fence, with parishioners putting out produce from their own gardens on the fence from time to time.
- The Pastoral Care Ministry helps ensure that those who cannot make it to church are able to regularly take communion, are assured that they are a beloved part of our community, and ensure that everyone who needs it feels the power of healing prayer. This team of volunteers visits with those who are homebound or hospitalized, bringing the Eucharist with them, and offers healing prayer on the first Sunday of every month during communion.
- **Fellowship Ministry** works through hospitality to love and focus on loving and serving God's purposes through and for each other.
