Cured by his touch! In this Sunday's Gospel, we hear that after Jesus finished preaching and healing the man with the evil spirit in the synagogue, he and his apostles went to Peter's home. Peter's mother-in-law was sick in bed with a high fever. "They immediately told Jesus about her."

Even this early in Jesus' ministry, the apostles could see the tender, caring, powerful love Jesus showed to others. They trusted he would take care of Peter's mother-in-law. Jesus went over to her, took her by the hand and helped her up from the bed. Immediately, her fever disappeared and she was well again. She returned Jesus' kindness by preparing and serving a delicious meal for him and his apostles.

This little miracle caused much excitement among the family and neighbors, but it was nothing compared to the news spreading about the countryside about the healing of the man in the synagogue. In the evening, "the whole town" gathered in the street in front of Peter's home hoping Jesus would cure those who were sick with all kinds of diseases. 
