Gut-Level Compassion

Recently I had a skin rash, and it was awful. I am embarrassed to admit that I didn't handle it well. Complaining, whining, begging for sympathy, and crying were my responses to the merciless itching and burning. In the aftermath, a silver lining emerged. I feel a new heartfelt sympathy for all those vexed with chronic skin problems. If you've ever had a seemingly unending skin problem, you know how that sympathy flows up from deep inside.

This gut-level compassion is something like what the Gospel describes in Jesus when the sore-covered leper says, "If you will it, you can make me clean." At this, just before the healing, Jesus was "moved with compassion." The Greek word

used here is strong and earthy, closer to "his bowels and guts trembled with the deepest emotions of sadness, pity, and love." In Jesus, God heals our infirmities not from a divine distance but by learning what it feels like to be us. He acquires first-hand experience of what it costs us to be afflicted and still be faithful to God. He sympathizes with the burning, itching, and blistering of human existence in the deepest, first-hand way. To discover that is to touch Jesus' heart.

What in your life, right now, is breaking out like diseased skin? What is getting worse the more you try to soothe it? Perhaps only you feel it. Or maybe it's exposed to all. A bad habit, broken relationship, loneliness, fear of failure, self-hatred? Name it, and then find a way to bring it confidently to Jesus who will feel what we are feeling, and thereby heal us. ©LPi



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Need Proof?

To be a faithful disciple, one must sometimes suspend disbelief and rely on faith. After all, our religion believes in the "seen and unseen" as God has created it. Even the apostle Thomas said that he would not believe Jesus had risen until he put his finger into his hands and into his side (Jn 20:25-28). How often do you seek out proof in order to believe? For many, where faith lacks, science can justify. This Lent, you may wish to question for yourself where your own faith may be lacking. The Eucharistic Revival is a result of many Catholics lacking belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. There is also a lack of reverence and love for the Eucharist because the understanding, knowledge, and appreciation for the Eucharist has fallen out of favor. Some people just need proof in order to believe.

This may very well be the case for the Eucharistic Miracle of Buenos Aires, Argentina in 1996. A parishioner at St. Mary Church noticed that pieces of consecrated host fell on top of the corporal, the cloth covering the portion of the altar where the host and chalice are consecrated. The parishioner informed the parish priest who, rather than consume the Precious Body, placed it in a special container holding water in order for it to dissolve, a liturgically correct procedure for such circumstances. The container was then placed in the tabernacle. Upon checking the container, the priest began to notice that the Precious Body was not

dissolving but changing. Bloodcolored stains began to appear and grow. He contacted the Archbishop who advised the priest to maintain the item in the tabernacle. The Archbishop pursued testing of the contents of the container. In a blind analysis, meaning that the scientist who studied the contents did not know what it was or how it was obtained, concluded that the substance was tissue from the left ventricle of the human heart, the area of the heart that powers the rest of the heart. The tissue sample that was the consecrated host indicated that the person suffered severe trauma. The testing also showed that the sample was taken while the heart was still beating. The results of the testing also showed that the person was struggling to breathe and had suffered a tremendous blow to the left side of the body. These results were similar to the results found in the Eucharist of Lanciano, Italy in 750. This is proof that Jesus's heart is truly present in the Eucharist and that it beats for us every time.

Need more proof? Check out this and many more examples of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist as we welcome *The Eucharistic Miracles of the World* exhibit February 29-March 3. This exhibit, assembled by Blessed Carlos Acutis, will strengthen your faith in the Real Presence. Proof positive.



SAINT OF THE WEEK



Blessed Imelda Lambertini

Blessed Imelda Lambertini (1322-1333) was born in Italy. Her parents recognized her extraordinary spiritual gifts early on and, when Imelda asked to live with the Dominican sisters, they agreed.

From the moment she entered the convent, Imelda developed a love for the Mass and the Eucharist. although at age 9, she was too young to receive it at the time. She would spend hours in prayer and Eucharistic adoration, and was known to enter deep states of contemplation.

In 1333, as she knelt in prayer, a Eucharistic miracle unfolded before everyone's eyes. The sacred Host miraculously lifted into the air and suspended directly above her, shining a radiant light onto her. This miracle, witnessed by the sisters as well as by the priest who was celebrating Mass, persuaded her superiors to allow her to finally receive Communion. Praying in the chapel after the miraculous event the sisters later found she had died with a smile on her face.. ©LPi



In the Gospel today, Jesus, moved with pity, touched the leper and healed him. Let us pray today for the grace to be generous with our gifts to help those who are suffering.

By your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul you indeed put your faith into action as you bring healing to the poor, hungry, and weeping.

In December we helped a family with 10 children whose father had lost his job, the mother had two emergency hospitalizations, and there were medical bills associated with the children. Your Giving Tree donations helped this family to have some hope at Christmastime.

We also helped a 61-year-old man who lost his job due to an injury. We provided him with rent assistance, gave him a bus pass to help seek new employment, and furnished him with a voucher to the St. Vincent de Paul store to get him a winter coat and boots.

In addition to helping people in our community, we are currently partnering with St. John Neumann and St. Mary's in Waukesha. Both parishes receive more requests for help than they are able to serve on their own.

There are many ways you can help St. Vincent de Paul besides your donations. Two example are:

- Bakery delivery help: Pick up day old bakery from Pick 'n Save and deliver to the St. Vincent de Paul store. The time required can be as little as a few hours one day a month.
- Serve a meal at the Hope Center once every three months: Bring some desserts and milk, serve, and help with cleanup. It would only require a couple hours of your time.




