REFLECTION

Mary Lestina has been working in ministry all her life, thanks to the example of her parents who instilled in the family a love for God and sharing faith with those around us. As a pastoral associate, she serves those who are seeking to join the Church, engaged couples preparing for marriage, and providing compassion to those needing prayer and support.



In October of 2023, I attended the Madison Eucharistic Congress with other members from St. Dominic. I was able to see and pray the Eucharistic Miracles from around the world on that occasion, a work that was researched and published by Blessed Carlo Acutis. How fitting that this coming week, we will have the exhibit available here at the parish for us to meditate on and be drawn into the miracles of Jesus revealed in his body and blood.

Carlo died at the age of 15, and was beatified in 2020. A first class relic of Blessed Carlo will also be available for us to venerate and reflect on this young man's life and love for Jesus. May he become one of your new favorite "saints."

While I was in Madison and was praying in front of his relic, I was drawn to one of his prayers: "Jesus, make yourself at home! Live within me as if it were your own dwelling!" – Carlo Acutis.

I meditated a long time on this reality, 'live within me as if it were your own dwelling.' How insignificant and unworthy I felt. I found myself in tears realizing the gap of this reality. This amazing God within me. How can this God come into my life, unworthy, sinful, doubting, imperfect, weak, and broken as I am? Lent is the time we look back at the past year, acknowledge our brokenness, and allow our Lord into our hearts, to heal us and open ourselves to His love. His love is what we often run from because we don't feel worthy. We don't want to look at our flaws and sins, our failures and wrong doings. It is tough to acknowledge where we failed. Yes, it is in our brokenness that room can be made for repentance that can bring us home to His heart. It is confusing to believe that it is in our brokenness that God can work in and through our lives. In Paul's letter to the Ephesians we read, "But God, who is rich in mercy, because of the great love he had for us, even when we were dead in our transgressions, brought us to life with Christ." (Eph. 2: 4-5).

What a great hope we have that our Lenten journey can bring us to new life by "cleaning out the crud in our lives." Friends, let us make this Lent a new season for our souls. How can we do this? Come to Jesus in the Mass, in adoration, in silent prayer, and in the sacrament of reconciliation. When receiving Him in the Eucharist, allow Him to penetrate your heart, to change and renew you in His love. His love will transform you. Then together with Blessed Carlo, our prayer can be, "live in me as if it were your own dwelling." Blessed Lent my friends. Blessed to journey with you to His heart.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Miracles

This week, St. Dominic will be providing the opportunity to view a travelling exhibit created by Blessed Carlo Acutis entitled, *The Eucharistic Miracles of the World*. Seeing the many instances of Eucharistic miracles assembled from around the world and across time by this young man beckons every disciple to renew their relationship with Jesus through the Blessed Sacrament: the Real Presence of Jesus Christ body and blood, soul and divinity.

It is understandable that miracles bring out the skeptic, those who lack the faith and trust to suspend disbelief in acceptance of Truth. Miracles are signs of God's power and loving presence (The Catholic Faith Handbook, 2013, p99). Therefore, many things can be considered a miracle through the eyes of faith. In Scripture, Jesus performs a wide variety of miracles, also known as mighty works/deeds or signs of wonder, involving nature, healing, deliverance, victory over hostile wills, and resuscitations (Catholic Source Book, 2000, p203-204) in order to bring about belief in Him as the Messiah. For an event to be miraculous today, it must:

- be exclusively attributed to a divine power (God) - it does not have a natural explanation, does not have paranormal origin, and is not traceable to manipulation of the enemy,
- be beyond the power of created nature,
- be beyond the order of created nature,

- extraordinary,
- sensible subject to perception by the senses.

The Church's eventual approval of a Eucharistic miracle contains the following elements:

- the event in question does not contain anything that contradicts faith and morals,
- it is lawful to make it public,
- the faithful are authorized to give their prudent assent to it.

Even though no one is obliged to believe in them, a believer should show respect for the Eucharistic miracles, whose authenticity has been recognized by the Church. (miracolieucaristici.org/en/Liste/ pref_RM.html)

A prime example would be the Eucharistic miracle of Tixtla, Mexico in 2006. While many of its elements resemble that of the miracles in Lanciano, Italy, and Buenos Aires, Argentina, a significant element to this miracle sets it apart. Like these others, the consecrated host began to emit blood and was taken for scientific evaluation. Like the others, the sample indicated living heart tissue and AB blood type. However, with this instance, DNA was extracted from the blood. Miraculously, the scientists were never able to extract a genetic sequence from the DNA as the Holy Spirit is the Father, and the Holy Spirit would not have a genetic profile. The Trinity was, is, and always will be.

I believe; help my unbelief.

Today's Gospel Reading


Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 9:2-10. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.



Blessed Carlo Acutis

From an early age, Blessed Carlo Acutis (1991–2006) displayed a deep love for Christ in the Eucharist. He also loved sports, particularly soccer, playing video games, reading graphic novels, and volunteering with those in need outside of his school hours.

He spent time in prayer before his parish's tabernacle either before or after every Mass he attended. He tried to go to Mass daily and he saw the Eucharist as a tangible manifestation of God's love.

With his tech-savvy skills, young Carlo spent four years creating a website that catalogued Eucharistic miracles from around the world. The purpose of his site was to increase awareness and appreciation for the Eucharist while also celebrating the worldwide Church. His hope for this project was to inspire those who visited the site to deepen their faith and develop a stronger relationship with Jesus. Carlo is the first millennial to be beatified. 
