
REFLECTION

Jill Fischer has been involved with Catholic education her whole life. As our director of discipleship and formation, she looks forward to helping all our members grow in relationship with Jesus every day. After all, we are called to be the hands of Jesus in the world and you can only do that by knowing Him.



I am going to reveal a secret. I don't "get" the analogy of Jesus as living water. Our gospel this weekend is the story of The Woman at the Well. While I "get" the encounter, I don't "get" the analogy. That is until I started attending small group bible study.

Our group got to talking about this analogy. I owned that I didn't understand it. They kindly worked to help me. It took quite a bit as I was really stuck. The unpacking began with talking about how flowing water is better than stagnant water. It moves. I could relate to this because I am familiar with the difference between moving water and stagnant water. Moving water is better. Then the idea that moving water is spring fed, it bubbles up from a source that is constant. This I could understand as I am familiar with spring fed ponds and



lakes. The water is refreshing and "alive." The water wells up and spills out. So now if Jesus is living water, to have that water means that it fills you up and spills out. You can't contain it. I understood! When you have Jesus, when you are doing what you should be doing, a life or an energy springs up, overflows, and energizes you. You can't contain it, just like the woman at the well could not contain what she just learned.

In John 5: 34, we learn from Jesus that "My food is to do the will of the Father." What fills and sustains Jesus, like food sustains the body, is doing the will of the Father. This is what should fill and sustain us. Jesus is our food, the Eucharist, and He is our living water. Doing His will, the Father's will, this is what matters. This is what should fill us and sustains us and nothing else. Everything else is useless filler. Doing what you were born to do fills you up and sustains you.

This is the whole point of the Called and Gifted Workshop. It is the opportunity to explore what it is that God created you to do to build the Kingdom. When you are operating out of that space, a life or an energy springs up, overflows, and energizes you. I encourage all disciples to consider participating in our next workshop on April 13. You might just find yourself bubbling over like the woman at the well.



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

How is your Lent going?

The Way is a mindset that we must all have as disciples. It is not a program St. Dominic is presenting. It is not a training course to participate in. The Way is the life that Jesus told us to live: a life focused on Him. Lent is a time for us to put that way of life front and center. Lent is a time to examine how we are committing ourselves to a life rooted in Jesus Christ. In other words, The Way is what Lent is all about. The Way is our response to the call to holiness as disciples every day of our lives. It is recapturing what our culture has lost and making sure we don't lose it. Ever.

St. Paul often explains the spiritual life in athletic terms. "Train yourself in godliness; for while bodily training is of some value, godliness is of value in every way, as it holds promise for the present life and also for the life to come ... For to this end we toil and strive" (1 Timothy 4:7-8, 10). This sounds a little arduous. But it is hard to argue with Paul's logic. Intense exercise leads to gains in strength, flexibility, stamina, and energy. It Is well worth the effort just on the natural and physical level; how much more so when the training regimen yields eternal benefits. (What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith, Ascension Press, 2022, p.142). This training is what Lent repeatedly calls us to especially if we fall off the training schedule the remainder of the year. This training is what The Way is. It is setting our minds to discipline for a higher purpose. Rather than diet, exercise, and rest, we are focusing on prayer, fasting, and almsgiving to reach that ultimate end. Lent provides us with



accountability. That accountability shouldn't end with Lent. Lent should help us set the course and then continually elevate our game. But just like sport, you have to pick the combination that best suits you. Just like any exercise regimen you start, you should always consult a physician. Be sure you consult the Divine Physician in your prayer life.

Lord, am I on the right path?

Lord, what is getting in the way of me being the best version of what you have created me to be?

Lord, help me to eliminate that bad habit I've fallen into and provide me the strength to start over?

Lord, what is it that I may do for you today?





SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Peter Julian Eymard

St. Peter Julian Eymard, (1811-1868) was born in France. He frequently had lung issues and migraines that disrupted his life. He was ordained a priest at the age of 23. After a few assignments he chose to join the Marists and entered the Society of Mary seminary. By 1844 he had risen to the position of Provincial of the congregation.

While visiting neighboring Marist communities, Eymard experienced the perpetual adoration of the Eucharist for the first time. His devotion to Christ in the Blessed Sacrament grew and he decided to start a Marist community devoted to perpetual adoration. His vision wasn't supported by his Marist superiors, so he eventually chose to leave, to start his new religious congregation, The Society of the Blessed Sacrament for men and, along with Marguerite Guillot, the Servants of the Blessed Sacrament for women. He also inspired those estranged from the Church to return, and worked to educate all about Christ. ©LPi
