

Wake Up


This weekend begins one of my favorite weeks of the Church year— Holy Week. The week that is set apart from every other week, for that is what the word "Holy" means, set apart. We take a week to recall the suffering and death of Christ so that on Easter Sunday, we can celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus and the hope of a new life in heaven for each of us. This weekend's Gospel walks us through the whole account of Jesus' suffering and death. As I wrote this reflection, I wasn't sure what I could say that Jesus didn't already say through His action of suffering and dying. He literally is showing us just how much He loves us. But as I pondered this account of God's love for humanity, I was struck by a small detail in the Agony in the Garden that I had never noticed. Before Jesus begins His journey, He seeks the solitude of prayer in the garden. He takes Peter, James, and John with Him and then retreats to pray. He then returns three times only to find the apostles asleep. This threefold sleep that we see the apostles taking struck me for the first time because only a short while later, we see Peter deny Jesus three times.

While numbers do play a huge role in biblical history, the reason that the threefold sleep of the apostles struck me is because every time that I reflect upon the passion of Christ, I am caught by Peter's threefold denial.

Peter, who claims that his faith will never be shaken, denies Jesus three times. The seemingly insignificant mention of the threefold sleep of the Apostles is important because the early Church Fathers enlighten us to the fact that this sleep, that Jesus is calling Peter to awaken from, is not bodily sleep by spiritual sleep. His faithfulness to Christ will be tested and Jesus is calling Peter to wake up and be strong against the temptations. We know that Peter does end up falling into temptation and denying Jesus, however, this denial does not lead to death, but to life, as later, after the Resurrection, we see that Peter has the chance to affirm His love for Jesus three times.

As we begin the most sacred week of the year, Jesus is calling us to wake up spiritually, to not succumb to temptations, to not be unfaithful. Jesus walked this path of suffering so that we might know His love, His mercy, and His faithfulness to us. Let us take this week, especially Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday, to walk this journey with Jesus. Come sit with Him in the silent garden after Mass on Holy Thursday, let Him strengthen your hearts against temptation. Then come kneel with Mary and John at the foot of the Cross on Good Friday as Jesus died for you, and lastly, come rejoice on Easter as we proclaim with joyous hope that JESUS CHRIST has risen!

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

A Story of Giving

How is your Lent going?

With only a few more days remaining to our Lenten journey, have the pillars of Lent helped you to hear and respond to your call to holiness? To ponder and practice almsgiving is to ponder the entire story contained in the Bible; the story of our salvation is a story of giving. The entirety of God's history with us is a story about giving.

Creation is itself a pure gift from God – testimony to divine generosity. And, then, when humanity thumbed its nose at him, he gave them the even greater gift of salvation through his only begotten Son. That son, giving the last drop of his blood, gave also to his disciples his body and his Spirit. Finally, the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life, proceeded to give us life plus every good gift to sustain that life (What We Believe: The Beauty of the Catholic Faith, Ascension Press, 2022, p.179).

And here we are complaining about a few dollars in stewardship or a few hours of our time in service. What are we thinking? We should really stop and consider what almsgiving really is, it is a life of mercy. If God is love, which translates into pure generosity, then we who are divinized by the Spirit are being transformed into those who love and who give. The ultimate goal of the gift is to make those who receive it givers. If we are to consider ourselves true disciples, Christ working through us means Christ giving through us (p. 179). Christ never hesitated to give to the other. Christ gave to the point of death.

Fasting and almsgiving are closely connected. In both practices, we realign our hearts to God and so become more sensitive to the needs of those around us. And the resources we free up – our time and money in particular – become available to them in the alms we give and the mercy we share. (p. 178)

Here are some practical tips for making fasting and almsgiving a regular part of our lives beyond the Lenten season. These are things to consider as disciples on The Way (p. 178):

- Occasional, moderate fasting from something rather small but which we enjoy a great deal (Starbucks once a week, an expensive creamer, a cocktail, a fast meal on the run, salt, candy, etc)
- Fasting from looking at our phones during meals with others
- Fasting from looking at our phones to pass time so as not to engage with the world or others
- Having the humility to get all the sleep one needs in order to live well and with charity

Dear Lord, teach me to be generous; teach me to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to heed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labor and not to ask for reward, save that of knowing that I do your will. Amen.

Or am I like Peter, afraid of what might happen to me if others realize that I know Jesus? Am I like Judas, betraying Jesus to keep up appearances?

It is remarkable how every detail fits into place. Everything is happening for a reason. When you look back on the events and details of your life, can you see how everything in your life fits into place? How everything has happened for a reason? Can you see God in it?







St. Toribio Romo

As a priest, St. Toribio Romo dedicated himself to serving the faithful in the midst of the Cristero War, a period of intense religious persecution in Mexico during the 1920s and 1930s.

Despite the danger posed by the anti-Catholic government, Romo continued to carry out his pastoral duties, and was frequently forced more and more to do so in secret or under the cover of night. He became known for his compassion and selflessness. For a time, he had to hide in an abandoned distillery in the town of Tequila in order to avoid violence, and celebrated Mass there for the community.

Tragically, on February 25, 1928, Romo was murdered. He was shot twice by government troops who broke into his bedroom while he was asleep. His martyrdom became a powerful testimony to the enduring strength of the Catholic Church in Mexico in the face of discrimination. St. Toribio Romo. pray for us! ©LPi


