# REFLECTION

Fr. Dennis was installed as pastor of St. Dominic Catholic Parish in October 2018, after serving for one year as parish administrator. His faith is based on the fact that we are all called to respond to God's love. He loves us first, and in that invitation is answered a desire that is deep within all of us.



#### He is Not Here

"He is not here, he has been raised" (Luke 24:6a). Of all the passages in the bible this is one of my two favorites, the other being the exchange between Jesus and the "good thief." "He is not here" is short, simple, direct . . . and life changing. It is both mysterious and awe inspiring at the same time. These words of Jesus' absence from the tomb are meant to comfort.

The first proclamation of the Risen Lord is especially consoling to me and I would venture to others who have lost a loved one. For me, she is not here is a recurrent reality that I still grieve over, even though it has been several years. This time of year, coinciding with the brief illness my wife suffered before her death, always brings me to a special place of attention. Some years, clouds and darkness reign and some years, warmth and sunlight permeate my thoughts. This year, as I pondered the paschal mystery, I stopped on, "He is not here." It is because He is not here that I can live in joy and hope this Easter season.

Jesus conquered death and, in doing this, opened a way for all who grieve, who have etched into their daily lives that he or she is not here, to experience a place of hope and joy. Because "He is not here," we can live in HE IS NOT HERE; HE HAS RISEN! LUKE 24:6

this world with a sense of destiny. We do not have to worry as to what will happen to us, what is to become of us. Easter is a time when everything both in heaven and on earth cries out with new life—a new life we have all been granted as children of God.

I don't know how the season of Lent has been for you but, from wherever you are coming, it is time to put aside anything that keeps you from rejoicing that He is not here. Step out into the bright morning sunlight and feel its warmth. It is a gift from God, that Jesus our savior and our Lord is not here...He has risen.

# MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

#### A Resurrection People

As disciples, we are considered an Easter people. What does that mean? It means that we embrace the joy and hope of the resurrection all the time not just on Easter. How do we embrace the joy every day? Through the practices of the Catholic Church's deep traditions that are rooted in prayer, fasting, and almsgiving beyond that of Lent. These practices are the works of mercy, the gifts of the Holy Spirit, the fruits of the Holy

Spirit, and virtue. These practices, through the Holy Spirit whom Jesus left for us as an advocate, allow us to experience Easter all the time if we only allow it. "During the Easter season, we celebrate our belief that the Spirit of the risen Lord is right here, in the community of faith, giving us both the desire and the ability to share the Good News" (Living the Mass: How One Hour a Week Can Change Your Life, Fr. Dominic Grassi and Joe Paprocki, Loyola Press, 2011, p45)

There are articles circulating around lamenting that the largest religious category in the United States is the "nones." These are individuals who have rejected religious affiliation. It is of concern because "the rise of the 'nones' has resulted in not only lessened religious participation but also a decrease in civic engagement, with 'nones' being less likely to vote, do volunteer work, or have strong friend groups or community" (pewresearch.org, January 24, 2024). As a people of hope, how do we stem this epidemic? How do we turn the tide? A study done by the Center for

Applied Research in the Apostolate at Georgetown University looked at the practices of parents who successfully raise children to be practicing Catholic adults. "The overall conclusion of the study was that children who grow up in a warm and affectionate home – spending time with their family in fun, prayer, and service to others – are more likely to remain Catholic as adults" (Raising Catholic Kids: New Study Suggests What Successful Parents Have In Common, Jonah McKeown, Catholic



News Agency, February 7, 2024).

Family is the heart of society. This is not new information. It isn't surprising that in a culture where there is tremendous breakdown and threats to the family, that we should find ourselves in a situation like the one we are in. "Among households that were successful in fostering lasting faith, children understood their parents to be open to hearing and talking about the children's doubts and struggles when it came to faith – an environment where kids didn't feel like they would be lectured or scolded for having questions or struggles or doubts. If a question

arose that the parents didn't have the answer to, they would pursue the answer together – authoritative without being authoritarian." Now this is not to point blame. This is not to make anyone feel guilty. This is not to assign a scapegoat for all the ills of our society. No, this is a call to examine our approach to living as disciples.

Faith begins in the home. Home and family can be many things. Sharing your faith with the next generation so that they see it as an authentic, living

> way of honoring the Lord who made us and died for us is critical. It isn't the priests job, although their role is very important. It isn't the parish staff's role, the Catholic school teacher's role, or the catechist's role, it is the parents role to demonstrate and live the importance of a relationship with God. It is not merely words but actions. It takes all of us doing our very best to be holy that inspires the next generation

to strive to be holy. It is in striving to be holy that we can live with great joy. I know many people have been let down by a church that is run by people. I'm sorry for that. That doesn't need to be the end. There is the resurrection. There is something after. There is life after.

# Venerable Francis-Xavier Nguyễn Văn Thuân

Venerable Francis-Xavier Nguyễn Văn Thuận, (1928 –2002) was born in Vietnam. When Saigon fell to the North Vietnamese Army, Francis-Xavier was arrested for his faith and connections. For the next 13 years, he endured immense hardships in captivity, including nine years of solitary confinement.

Throughout his imprisonment, Francis-Xavier's devotion to Jesus sustained him. Denied access to the Mass and to the Sacraments, he secretly celebrated Mass while confined with whatever resources he could find. While imprisoned, he became known for his joyful spirit, sharing hope and encouragement with fellow prisoners, and writing powerful faith reflections on scraps of paper. He was released from prison in 1988, In 1994, Pope John Paul II appointed him as the president of the Pontifical Council for Justice and Peace, recognizing his dedication to promoting peace, reconciliation, and social justice. ©I Pi
