The Merciful Love of God

Divine Mercy Sunday is my favorite Sunday of the whole liturgical year.

Why is it my favorite? Because it points us to the merciful love of God that lies behind the whole Paschal Mystery which we celebrated last week.

The word 'mercy' comes from the Latin misericordia, which comes from the two words miseria, meaning wretchedness, misery, or affliction, and cor, meaning heart. The Gospel is the revelation in Jesus Christ of God's mercy to sinners, each and every one of us.

Blood and water flow from the side of Jesus as the soldiers pierce his side as he hangs on the cross. The heart of Jesus is pierced, for you and me. The blood of the covenant forever securing my redemption, and water that cleanses me, as I die with Christ in his death and rise with Him to new life.

This Sunday's gospel is the story of Thomas putting his fingers in Jesus' side. He gets a pretty bad wrap but, the truth is, that's you and me, doubting the love and mercy of God every step of the way.

Jesus really died, really rose again, and in his resurrected body he has the scars of his wounds. In Jesus, the

prophesy of Isaiah 53:5 is fulfilled. "But he was wounded for our transgressions, crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the punishment that made us whole, and by his wounds we are healed."

On Divine Mercy Sunday, may we be

immersed in the infinite, deep, mercy of God and be reminded no one is too far gone.

Works of Mercy

Today we celebrate Divine Mercy Sunday. In a series of revelations to St. Maria Faustina Kowalska in the 1930s, our Lord called for a special feast day to be celebrated on the Sunday after Easter. The Lord expressed His will with regard to this feast in His very first revelation to St. Faustina. The most comprehensive revelation can be found in her Diary entry 699.

"My daughter, tell the whole world about My inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and a shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day are opened all the divine floodgates through which graces flow. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity. Everything that exists has come from the very depths of My most tender mercy. Every soul in its relation to Me will contemplate My love and mercy throughout eternity. The Feast of Mercy emerged from My very depths of tenderness. It is My desire that it be solemnly celebrated on the first Sunday after Easter. Mankind will not

have peace until it turns to the Fount of My mercy."

I wish to share with you another passage from the Diary of St. Faustina Kowalska as spoken by Jesus as part of entry 742:

"I demand from you deeds of mercy, which are to arise out of love for Me. You are to show mercy to your neighbors always and everywhere. You must not shrink from this or try

be acts of mercy, and I demand the worship of My mercy through the solemn celebration of the Feast and through the veneration of the image which is painted. By means of this image I shall grant many graces to souls. It is to be a reminder of the demands of My mercy, because even the strongest faith is of no avail without works."

It is quite clear through St. Faustina's diary, that Jesus demands much from us for our own salvation. He is offended terribly by many things that we as humans do. Therefore, I wish to remind us as His disciples of our responsibilities toward mercy. The criteria is known as the Corporal and Spiritual Acts of Mercy. These are not actions that happen by accident, but are intentional and proactive.

Corporal works: feed the hungry, shelter the homeless, clothe the naked, visit the sick and imprisoned, give alms to the poor, bury the dead.

Spiritual works: instructing those who do not know Him, advising those falling into temptation, consoling,

comforting, forgiving, bearing wrongs patiently, and praying for the living and the dead.

These works are to be done with an attitude of charity, known only by you and the Father. What is on a person's soul at death is how a person will be judged. That is real. Let us take care to not offend God further. Let us take action in order to receive His mercy.



to excuse or absolve yourself from it.

I am giving you three ways of exercising mercy toward your neighbor: the first – by deed, the second – by word, the third – by prayer. In these three degrees is contained the fullness of mercy, and it is an unquestionable proof of love for Me. By this means a soul glorifies and pays reverence to My mercy. Yes the first Sunday after Easter is the Feast of Mercy, but there must also

GOING DEEPER

Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: John 20:19-31. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

"Jesus came, although the doors were locked." This passage most likely is speaking about the physical doors of the building that the Apostles were in, but this sentence can draw us to ask the deeper question, what about the doors of my heart? Are the doors of your heart open to receiving Jesus or are you waiting for proof that Jesus exists?

Thomas proclaims in verse 28 "My Lord and my God!" We should also be proclaiming this at every elevation of the Holy Eucharist. Is Jesus truly your Lord and God? What do you need to do to make Him so?

What does the phrase, "As the Father has sent me, so I send you" mean for you? Does it apply to you or someone else? Do you take it to heart or do you dismiss it?

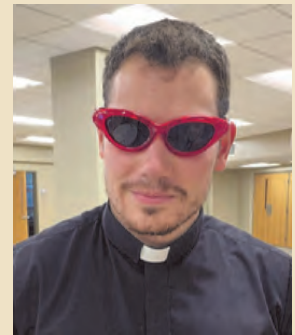

A Beacon of Hope - Rooted and Rising

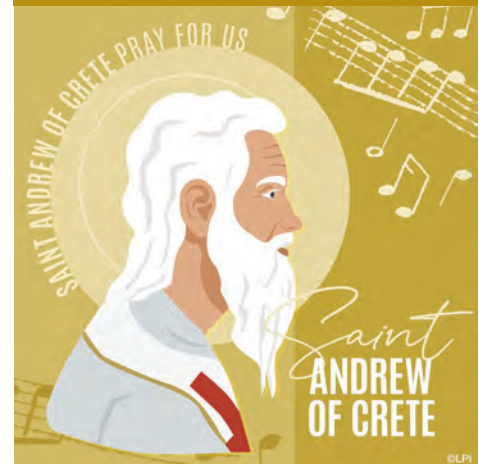

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Andrew of Crete

St. Andrew of Crete (650-c.726) was born to devout Christian parents. According to legend, he was mute until he was 7 years old and miraculously cured after he received his First Holy Communion.

Andrew entered a monastery near Jerusalem. His exceptional qualities lead to his appointment as Archdeacon. He was also sent to represent the Church at the Sixth Ecumenical Council, playing a role in addressing the heresy of Monothelitism. This Sixth Council was pivotal in establishing that Jesus had both a divine and human nature.

St. Andrew would become an influential theologian, bishop, and hymnographer. Around the year 700 he was appointed Archbishop of the city of Gortyn, on the island of Crete. He is credited with introducing the canon, a new form of hymn, into the liturgy. His most renowned work, the Great Canon, is a masterpiece that guides the faithful through repentance and a return to God.

Acts of prayer as you journey at home:


