The Joy of Easter

How is your Easter going? Are you still celebrating the joy of this season?

Sometimes I think we, as a Catholic church, don't put enough emphasis on the Easter season. The same is true of the Christmas season. We put so much emphasis on the preparation, the repentance, the waiting of the purple seasons. We fill our calendars to the brim with ways to engage Lent,



to dive in and dig deep. And then the Day comes – Easter, Christmas – and it's over and wrapped up like a wedding day. No more programming. No diving in or digging deep together. Just life as usual, as if nothing happened. As if nothing changed. As if we hadn't changed.

That's not the way it is supposed to be, right? Lent is not more important than Easter. But the way we engage the two would suggest that it is. We only "do" Lent for the purpose of "doing" Easter better. We practice repentance to allow our hearts and spirits to more fully embrace the fullness of Easter...that is all seven weeks of it. Easter is almost twice as long as Lent. So why do we treat it like it is a single day?

It is the fifth week of the Easter season, but I invite you, challenge you even, to look at how well you are celebrating – or not celebrating – the Resurrection. You have a few more weeks to go. What is something you can do to reignite the joy of Easter and celebrate Christ's victory over sin and death? What were the practices you took up for Lent? How have you seen a change in yourself through those practices? How can you carry that transformation forward throughout the Easter season and beyond?

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Practicing Catholics

I recently heard that there is no such thing as a "cradle Catholic;" meaning you were surrounded by a Catholic culture your whole life, but you really didn't become a Catholic until you decided to become a Catholic. Even then, you may not have decided, but someone decided for you. Stop and think; when did you decide to become a Catholic? When did you make the conscious decision to give your life to Jesus, not just in words, but in the core of your being that emanates out into every facet of your life? This is what it means to live The Way. The constant striving to turn your life over to Jesus. To make Him. the center of your existence.

"As we go forth from Mass to glorify the Lord with our lives, we can carry out our mission effectively if we rely on the following habits or virtues. These virtues take time and effort to develop but through practice, they can become a natural part of our lives. By focusing on these responsibilities and the manner in which we carry them out, we can commit ourselves to being "practicing Catholics" not only on Sunday but always" (Living the Mass: How one hour a week can change your life, Grassi and Paprocki, Loyola Press, 2011, p.171). If you consider yourself a "practicing Catholic," are you practicing these virtues?

Faith: makes us able to trust God completely and to accept all that God has revealed and taught

Hope: the desire for all the good things God has planned for us

Charity: love God above all things and our neighbors as ourselves

Prudence: helps us to decide what is good and then choose to do it

Justice: leads us to respect the rights of others and to give them what is rightfully theirs

Fortitude: the courage to do what is right, even when it is very difficult

Temperance: helps us balance what we want with what we need (self-control)

If you have claimed Jesus as your own, and you are practicing your Catholicism, you should be experiencing ongoing change, known as conversion. This is what living The Way produces, a change "not measured by how much time we spend in the church building or on the parish grounds. Nor is the change necessarily related to our daily activities. The change is more about doing things for a new and different reason, with a new and different approach, and from a new and different source" (p.174). "God's will is our salvation. When Jesus says that 'the kingdom of God has come near.' he is telling us that salvation is all around us. The Eucharist opens our eyes to the reality of salvation above us, below us, in front of us, behind us, and all around us. As baptized followers of Jesus, we commit ourselves to revealing this reality to others. This takes practice. Daily practice. That's what it means to be practicing Catholics" (p. 178).

Without God we can do nothing, but with God we can do anything. What in your life are you trying to do without God? How can you begin to work with God in each aspect of your life?








Annual Mass of Atonement

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Teresa of Jesus

As a youth, St. Teresa of Jesus (1900-1920) read a biography of St. Thérèse of Lisieux that inspired her to grow in her faith and choose a religious vocation.

At the age of 19, she began her novitiate with the Carmelites and took the name "Teresa of Jesus." She was drawn to the Carmelites because she enjoyed the simple life offered in the convent, and the companionship of the other sisters living and serving Jesus alongside her. She also found joy in her proximity to the Blessed Sacrament.

During her short time with the Carmelites before her death, she wrote many letters which she considered her apostolate. Her writings frequently focused on her experiences of and thoughts on living a fulfilling spiritual life.

After a particularly violent attack of typhus, she was permitted to take her vows and received her last rites, dying just three months before her twentieth birthday. ©LPi


