Choices. Did you ever stop to think about the weight of that? Everything we do, except for our most basic biological functioning, requires choices. Do you ever wish, just once, you didn't have to make choices? There are actually terms such as "choice overload" and "decision making fatigue" that speaks to the mental toll that one can experience because we have to make so many choices every single day. Ugh!

However, in reading today's Gospel, we learn that there is one choice we don't have to make. "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain..." (Jn 15: 16). I don't have to make the choice of whether to belong to God. I only have to choose whether to remain with God. You and I are already His. Whew!

As I ponder this, I start thinking about that fear inducing, anxiety riddled experience of being selected by my peers to play on the team in gym class. Honestly, I hated when teams needed to be made by my peers for any situation. I can't recall ever being selected as captain. (Actually, I never wanted to be captain.) I know I was never selected first. I recall my selection being somewhere down near the bottom of the pack. I was a chubby kid, not athletic but not uncoordinated by any means. I could run, jump, catch, throw, but I was

average. This process was the worst of all judgements. It is as if The Chosen Ones were screaming "You are not good enough." Judge or be judged. So when God speaks today that He has already chosen me for His team without needing me to do anything, I question, "How can that be?" I am already on the team simply because He made me. All I need to do is show up and do the thing our team does. Play the game.

What game are we playing? Discipleship! The rules? To go and bear fruit that will remain. This is a game I can get behind because it requires no real skill set except all that I have come to know, appreciate, and love about God. I don't have to choose anything except how much effort I want to put into playing. It would be prudent of me to put in a lot of effort as the stakes are really high. While there is no trophy for participating, there is an ultimate prize – eternal life with Him. The best part, in my opinion, is that my winning has nothing to do with anyone else on the team. It is just about me playing the game to the best of my ability knowing that my ability is given to me by God. It is all between me and God. God knows if I am playing the game to the best of my ability or not. He is coach, line judge, and cheerleader because He wants me to succeed in playing the game.



7 Virtues of Discipleship

For over a year, St. Dominic has been advocating that all members participate in The Way—a Jesuscentered life. The only way to confront a God-less culture is to infuse God back into it in a public, normal, and magnetic way. To steal some language from a new publication from Evangelical Catholic, "a Jesus-led life is the surest path to the fulfillment of our hearts deepest longings" (The 10:10 Challenge: 10 Weeks, 10 Ways to a Jesus Led Life, 2024, p1). When others see what you have as a disciple, they will want it. It will be up to you to show them how to get

Discipleship means hearing and answering Jesus's call, resounding through the ages and found in every human heart, "Come, follow me.." It means choosing to learn from Jesus his way and his truth so that he might become our life. It means entering a lifelong journey with a decisive direction and an infinite horizon. This journey begins at Baptism, culminates in heaven, and in the in-between we discover, sometimes little by little, our deepest identity, our inestimable worth, and our highest calling - to become love as he is love." (p. 1)

Charity: Charity leads us to love God above all things and our neighbors as ourselves. Charity brings all the virtues together in perfect harmony.

Prudence: Prudence helps us to decide what is good and then choose to do it.

Justice: Justice leads us to respect the rights of others and to give them what is rightfully theirs. The just person considers the needs of others and always tries to be fair.

Fortitude: Fortitude is the courage to do what is right, even when it is very difficult.

Temperance: Temperance helps us balance what we want with what we need. It helps us moderate our desires for enjoyment and builds self -control.





SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Cyril of Jerusalem

St. Cyril of Jerusalem (c.315-386) was ordained a priest by the bishop of Jerusalem. He went on to serve as a catechist for those newly baptized in his congregations. The writings he produced during the early years of his priesthood have gone on to help give the modern Church a clear example of how the Church of the East did things during those first few centuries of Christianity. They included teachings on the real presence of Christ in the Eucharist, prerequisites for Baptism, the Eucharistic liturgy, and more.

During the fourth century, Cyril was ordained Bishop of Jerusalem. He was accused by his contemporaries of Arianism. (not believing in the divinity of Christ.) He was ultimately acquitted of the accusations.

St. Cyril and a bishop named Gregory, who would become

St. Gregory, attended the Council of Constantinople, where the Nicene Creed was officially adopted.

He was named as a Doctor of the Church in 1822. ©LPi

By your gift to the Society of St. Vincent de Paul you fulfill this commandment.




