Something is Happening

Every Pentecost Sunday the most compelling of the three readings for me is Acts 2:1-11. These slow-to-get-it, doubtful, and frightened Apostles *received the Holy Spirit as tongues of fire* and became **Courageous**. *Something Happened*.

The Apostles had one native language when they left the upper room to speak to the crowds who were from many nations with different languages, but everyone who heard the Apostles understood each word that was proclaimed. *Something Happened.*

Lately in America, doesn't it feel like we're speaking a foreign language to more and more of our neighbors? Doesn't it feel like in the era of more diverse ways to communicate, our communication with each other is breaking down and failing?

Changing definitions for generationsold established words and totally invented new words are leading to divisions. People talk while simultaneously scrolling social media, which means that attention is divided and leads to misunderstandings. Our families, neighborhoods, communities, and country has lost the ability to talk civilly with those we don't agree with. We can all name people in our lives who no longer speak to each other, and we are increasingly divided.

We could spend hours dissecting and theorizing the "why's." We could point to politics, social issues, media, and technology. Pointing fingers and straining to pinpoint the exact event or time that it fell apart and place blame is a waste.

This is not that complicated. America is no longer a Christendom. And we Christians often stay silent rather than proclaim Christ's message of repentance, redemption, forgiveness, and love.

The antidote to Anger and Hate is Forgiveness and Love. Jesus proved this as He died for our sins on the cross. We who are followers of Christ must speak as we are able and trust that the Holy Spirit will give us the words that allow others to hear. We who are followers of Christ, when faced with a debate about some divisive topic, must talk about Christ and proclaim His message. It begins with talking with those closest to us. We must find courage to Cross the Great Divide. ("Cross" reference intended).

What happened in Jerusalem on that first Pentecost was a miracle; born of the Holy Spirit to bring the Resurrection and Truth of Jesus Christ to the world.



Please contact me if you have any questions about the responsibilities, expectations, schedules, or time commitment of this vital role as Trustee.



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Why Are You Here?

Why are you here? I don't mean why are you sitting in this pew or reading this bulletin, although that is a good question, but why are you on this planet? What is your purpose? Have you determined what that is through prayer and discernment?

I was recently reading a book entitled, "If You Want to Walk on Water. You've Got to Get Out of the Boat," by John Ortberg. In it, an entire chapter is dedicated to discerning the call. A person's calling, and discerning that calling, is an awareness of precisely what God put you on this Earth to accomplish for His sake. Your calling answers the question of why you are here. To discern the will of the Father means spending time in prayer and contemplation in regard to the decisions you make for your life and for those important to you. There is an innate understanding that making decisions in this manner means that you are not in control, but that God is in control, and you want Him to be. Ultimately, "It is using one's endowed giftedness to serve the world with excellence and, through that service, to love and honor God" (Walk on Water, p.58).

You have a purpose – a design that is central to God's dream for the human race. We are, first of all, according to Scripture, called to know God, to receive his love and mercy, and to be his children. We are called to live in the reality of his kingdom and to have Christ formed in us. (p.58) As a crucial part of your calling, you were given certain gifts, talents, longings, and desires. To identify these with clarity, to develop them with skill, and to use them joyfully and humbly to serve God and his creation, is central to why you are created. (p.58)

Discerning a calling requires one of the greatest challenges of selfexploration and judgement a human being can undertake. Callings are usually not easy to discover. You will have to be ruthlessly honest about your gifts and your limitations. You will have to be willing to ask hard questions and live with the answers. Discerning God's calling will take many attempts and failures. You will have to be willing to let some dreams die a painful death. You did not arrive on this planet with your calling preclarified and your gifts predeveloped. You arrived with a little warning: some assembly required (p.59). A calling is something you discover, not something you choose (p. 60).

God chose us and not the other way around. His ways are not the ways of the world. God equips the worker and assigns the work. As you explore your role in the missionary field. what is your role? Why are you here? Start taking it to prayer, asking God, "Lord, what is it you would like me to do for you today?" Then listen. He will answer you.





SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Gregory VII (c.1015-1085) was born in Italy. He grew up in a devout Catholic family and his uncle, Laurentius, was abbot of a monastery in Rome.

As a young man, he became close with Pope Leo IX. After Pope Leo IX's death, he became a leading figure in the papal court of the next few popes.

Shortly after the death of Pope Alexander II, he was quickly ordained a priest and raised to the papacy. He chose the name Gregory VII in honor of the first Pope Gregory whose writings heavily influenced him. During his time as pope, Gregory VII worked hard to reform the Church he so loved.

At the time, the Church was facing corruption. People in leadership were selling sacred offices and sacramentals, some clergy were unlawfully marrying, and kings and nobles, were controlling the appointment of Church officials. Pope Gregory VII fiercely resisted these corruptions. Saint Pope Gregory VII, pray for us! ©LPi
