

More Than a Feeling


As a Catholic revert, it often breaks my heart to watch people take the Eucharist so lightly. About 4 years ago, when I still considered myself a nondenominational Christian, I attended an adoration night with my new Catholic friend. I had grown up Catholic, and I was even part of Life Teen in high school, so I was familiar with adoration. I never felt like I actually felt or experienced Jesus though, so, I concluded it couldn't be true. At this point, I thought whatever denomination you were didn't really matter, as long as you love Jesus and show that to others.

So, at this adoration night 4 years ago, I remember when the priest brought Jesus around. I thought to myself, "I'll give this one more chance." The priest brought the small host in the monstrance over. I looked at Jesus and he looked at me. I still didn't feel or experience anything spectacular.

In the coming months, I dove head first into Catholic theology, Church history, and studied the Scriptures deeper than I ever had before. I couldn't figure out what Jesus meant by, "this is my body, this is my blood." Was he really serious? As I learned things I had never known before, I couldn't deny the true Presence of my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. It was real. He was really, truly, present. For so many years, I had

been wrong. All because I couldn't "experience" Him there.

So often in my life, I have let my feelings guide my faith. I have learned that faith is far more than a feeling, although sometimes I do experience feelings. Faith also takes understanding, learning, and knowledge. Jesus does not ask us to blindly follow him. I realized encountering Jesus is a gift, not something to be strived after. I had a heart posture of, "Prove that you're real," instead of "Jesus, show me who you are and how much you love me." Now I have a confidence and assurance that my Savior is present, whether or not I can feel him there.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

The Law of Exposure

I recently completed the book, "If You Want to Walk on Water You've Got to Get Out of the Boat," by John Ortberg (Zondervan, 2001). In it he speaks to the "law of exposure." I haven't given this much thought since I was an undergraduate. As a social scientist, I spent a lot of time learning about and observing people and their behaviors. The law of exposure has a fundamental role in human development. As Ortberg shares the understanding of this law, "Your mind will think most about what it is exposed to. What repeatedly enters your mind occupies your mind, eventually shapes your mind, and will ultimately express itself in what you do and who you become" (p. 162). In other words, what our minds are constantly exposed to, attend to, and dwell on, eventually comes out in how we feel and what we do.

Think about that for a moment. Do the things that occupy your time, your mind, your space, reflect Truth, Beauty, and Goodness, or something else? "The events you attend, the material you read (or don't), the music you hear, the images you watch, the conversations you hold, the daydreams you entertain - all are shaping your mind, and ultimately, your character and destiny. This is supremely true when it comes to hope" (p. 163). Now think past yourself, what about what your children or grandchildren are seeing, watching, and hearing? Are our minds and hearts absorbed by things that are helping us forge a

relationship with Jesus and His Truth, Beauty, and Goodness, or those things that take us away from that? How much are you subjecting yourself to those things that are not good, not beautiful, and not of God's truth? Then stop!

As disciples, we are set apart. We are not to be of this world but of God. That requires careful attention to what we expose ourselves to. Yes, we can resist, but for how long based on the law of exposure? Here are some thoughts from Ortberg (p.165) for how to stay focused on Christ:

In a social setting, whisper "God" or "Jesus" quietly as you glance at each person near you. Practice seeing them as God does; a precious child of His.

At mealtime, have an extra chair at the table to remind you of the presence of Christ. As you see it, or touch it, remember His words "Lo, I am with you always..."

While reading a book or magazine, read it to Him! If you would be embarrassed to, don't read it.

When problem solving at work, instead of talking to yourself about the problem, develop a new habit of talking to Christ.

Keep a picture of Christ, a cross, or a word of Scripture some place where you will see it just as you're going to sleep. Allow God to have the last word of the day.

GOING DEEPER

Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 12: 12-16, 22-26. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

We hear Jesus say to His disciples, "Take and eat my body, take and drink my blood." Yet this is not just said to the disciples but to us today. Jesus gives us His entire self in the Eucharist. Does hearing those words make a difference in your life? How does your reception of Jesus's body and blood transform your life?

Do you believe that you are truly receiving Jesus's body and blood? Why or why not? Ask God to increase your belief in what He has told us to be true.

Today's passage seems to hinge on trust. The disciples had to trust Jesus's direction. The disciples had to trust Jesus with where they were going after the meal. To what degree do you trust Jesus? As obediently as the disciples do or so much as you are in control?

Parish Financial Update

2024-2025 Budget

Finance Council, in conjunction with the Trustees and Fr. Dennis, have approved our operating budget for fiscal year July 1, 2024 through June 30, 2025.

St. Dominic is blessed with generous parishioners and a growing community. We have budgeted a small surplus for the coming fiscal year.

We prioritize use of your stewardship gifts on:

- Forming and equipping missionary disciples
- Keeping Catholic education affordable
- Strengthening our parish school
- Maintaining robust student ministries

Parish budgeted income reflects:

- Projected continued growth in stewardship and offertory
- Stability in our revenue sources such as interest/ investment income; facility usage fees; parish festival profit, and columbarium niches
- No increase to Formation program fees as we cover most of these costs from stewardship gifts
- Pastoral Ministry and Outreach donations collected to support partnering groups are not reflected as revenues. St. Dominic Seniors is now a part of Pastoral Ministry.

School budgeted income reflects:

- No increase in school tuition for K5 through grade 8
- K3/K4 tuition increase commensurate with increasing costs to serve
- Lunch program and milk/snack fees increased in order to better cover the expense of food/milk
- Continued growth of school enrollment. Budget based on 425 students, up from 400 (K3—grade 8)

Parish and school budgeted expense reflects:

- Continued robust investment in Discipleship and Formation programs and parishioner engagement/ enrichment
- Compensation and Insurance Benefit increases
- Archdiocese Assessment and Liability annual increases
- Limiting discretionary Building & Grounds and Administrative expenses to offset increased utility and non-discretionary expenses


