





Apostasy

A word has entered into my consciousness lately and it keeps reinserting itself: apostasy. I first landed on it while preparing to read the Letter of St. Paul to the Hebrews. I then heard it again in a podcast. Then it was in a book I was reading. I figured since I've seen it 3 times, I need to pay attention to it. Apostasy is the formal disaffiliation from, abandonment of, or renunciation of a religion by a person. It can also be defined within the broader context of embracing an opinion that is contrary to one's previous religious beliefs. Apostasy is pretty prevalent right now and it continues to grow (American Beliefs Study, 2021).

As disciples, this can appear to be a very bleak and sobering reality. As we at St. Dominic pour everything we have into The Way, St. Paul assured us 2000 years ago, as he does today, that "You need endurance to do the will of God and receive what he has promised. (Hebrews 10:36). I see it as the Good News is already out of the tube. Once it is out, you really can't put it back in. We have scores of people out there who have heard of Jesus Christ so the toothpaste is already out of the tube. They are choosing not to use it. They may even be trying to put it back in the tube in the form of apostasy. We all know that is nearly impossible. Once you know it, you can't un-know it. Fortunately, God can do anything. He is using us to do something with that toothpaste.

In one quick Google search, I found

42 other uses for toothpaste besides brushing your teeth. According to recent statistics shared by the Vatican on April 24, 2024, the number of baptized Catholics has increased globally, rising from 1.376 billion in 2021 to 1.390 billion in 2022, with a relative increase of 1.0%. Just think, if every single one of those 1.390 billion Catholics shared a small bit of their faith story with the scores of people turning their backs on Christ, what a movement that would create! It would be a whole new Jesus revolution! That would be 1.390 billion uses of Jesus in our lives. Each story would be unique and different but quintessentially powerful. While we can't impact the globe, we can impact our community.

Do you have a story of an encounter with Jesus? Have you ever shared it? You should! Start with your circle of influence. Share what God did for you today. Share where you saw God in the ordinary as well as the extraordinary. Once you start, you won't be able to stop because the joy that results is so good. It is like sharing about the greatest toothpaste you let out of the tube and applied to your teeth. The result is clean and bright and refreshing.



Today's Gospel Reading


Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 3:20-35. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.


