Come Away and Rest

As I prepared to write this reflection, I found myself pacing in my office. I was deep into the, "Lord, reveal to me what you need your disciples to hear so that it be your words not mine." In the gospel from Mark I was struck by verse 31, "Come away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest a while." How often do we do that?

At this point in the Gospel of Mark, the apostles learn of John the Baptist's death. Jesus desperately tries remove them from the crowds so that they may come away by themselves and rest awhile. Jesus is encouraging selfcare. Jesus is encouraging time to mourn. Jesus is loving His disciples, striving to provide them with what they need, yet the crowds press on. What does this mean for our own lives?

Our culture has allowed us to believe that busy is better. That the busier you are the better you are. It is a badge of honor to share how impossible your schedule is. Why? Is busier better? Is it somehow a show of popularity? Is it arrogance to some degree? I have come to learn through many Saintly examples that the busier we are, the less charitable we are able to be, that if we don't set boundaries with our time, we are unable to respond to the demands of love around us. How does

the adage go? You can't give what you don't have. Jesus clearly knows that and strives to provide that for His disciples. We often see Jesus retreat in order to pray, to rest, to fill His cup. If He can do it, so should we. In today's Gospel, He is teaching this important practice, to go away to a deserted place to rest. As disciples, we must refresh, restore, and renew our energies in order to be the hands of Jesus in the world.

My fellow disciples, take time to go away by yourselves to a deserted place and rest awhile. Summer provides an opportunity to do that if we let it. This could mean turning off the radio in the car, sitting on the deck/patio so you are not distracted by the TV, putting down or putting away our phones, spending time just "being," or visiting church to sit before the tabernacle or in Adoration. Simply unwind and unplug. If this isn't part of your routine, might I suggest starting slow with 1 or 2 minutes and building up from there? To the unpracticed, one minute can seem like an eternity! Create a habit of withdrawing to fill your cup so that you can be a peacefilled disciple, one who is ready to respond to the demands of love placed before you on a daily basis. Go, rest a while.



Safe Environment Sessions



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

A Light in the Darkness

I recently took a two-week pilgrimage to Eastern Europe. Our pilgrim group visited the memorial of Auschwitz-Birkenau. Words can not begin to capture what I saw, what I felt, and what I thought. The tremendously overwhelming tragedy that was shared with such honesty, no blame or judgement, just pure fact, was more than my heart and head could manage. But there was light in the darkness; for many, a faith in God and in the goodness of humanity won out over the evil. For me, the experience was a testimony to the knowledge that God wins and He uses us to do so.

That experience was further illuminated by a visit to the home and parish of St. John Paul II, a quiet little unassuming town. His home has been turned into a museum that chronicles his life and accomplishments. Growing up as a child in the '80s watching this Pope on TV, I relished the opportunity to relive some of his most memorable moments, including the first World Youth Day and other public speeches. As I read the excerpts on the walls, I snapped photos of a few to serve as a reminder of this great man/Saint and the prophetic wisdom he shares.

"We need to remember those times of great test of consciences, because they are still a valid warning for us and a call for vigilances so that consciences of (Poles) do not become deprived. So that they do not give in to the trend of moral permissiveness. So that they are

able to discover the liberating character of the evangelical teaching and God's commandments, so that they are able to choose, bearing Christ's warning in mind. 'What good is it for someone to gain the whole world, yet forfeit their soul? Or what can anyone give in exchange for their soul?' Even though it might not seem so, the law of conscience has to be defended today also. Great, or perhaps even increasing, intolerance is spreading in the public life and in the mass media under cover of promotion of tolerance. This is particularly and painfully felt by believers. There is tendency to push them onto the margin of social life, to ridicule and scoff what they often hold the most sacred. These forms of recurring discrimination are worrying and they should give us a lot to think about. Brothers and sisters! The time of the test of (Polish) consciences is now! You need to be strong in your faith! Today, when you are struggling with regard to the future shape of the social and public life you should remember that it depends predominantly on what man will be like and what his conscience will be like." (Skoczow, 22 May 1995)

We have a role to play and a responsibility to tend to. Be courageous in your faith! If not you, who? If not now, when? God has placed you here, in this time and place, to fulfill that responsibility in the way that only you can. Need help? Today's Gospel Reading


Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 6:7-13. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.



St. Norbert of Xanten

Born to nobility, St. Norbert of Xanten (c. 1075-1134), served in the court of Henry V, Emperor of Germany, however, at court he lived a worldly and corrupt life. By the grace of God while traveling in a storm he was nearly struck by lightning and almost killed. This experience changed St. Norbert and he became penitent, left his court post, and after a period of discernment in a monastery, felt called to be a priest.

Norbert became an itinerant preacher, preaching against worldly attitudes but at the Pope's request finally settled in northern France and founded the Norbertine order established according to the rule of St. Augustine. The order grew rapidly and soon founded a women's branch. In Belgium he preached against heresies which denied the Blessed Sacrament, this earned him the title "Apostle of the Blessed Sacrament." He and those of his orders had a great love of and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament, with a devout faith in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. **©LPI**
