

A Matter of Life After Death

It's been a difficult year health-wise for many of my family members and friends. Regular updates about diagnoses and surgeries, tests and treatment plans has my mind thinking about Life and Death more than usual. A lyric comes to mind from my favorite band Rush: "learning that we're only immortal... for a limited time."

We live our days one day at a time and don't like to think about death because the afterlife is a giant question mark of unknowns. As Catholics, we believe quite profoundly in Life AFTER Death. Our souls are destined to exist for eternity.

At a recent staff meeting we discussed an article about the "Nones." Nones being those who have no affiliation with a formal religion. Atheism is on the rise, with more Americans rejecting the notion of God entirely, much less that Heaven and Hell are real. Another well-known quote comes to mind: "The greatest trick the Devil ever pulled was convincing the world he didn't exist." ~ Charles Baudelaire

Every one of us likely knows someone (or is that someone) who has experienced first-hand some inexplicable/miraculous event that transcends the corporeal and can best be described as Divine Intervention.

It is a matter of faith to recognize the handprint of God in those moments. It is a matter of fact that sometimes things happen that defy that which our human minds and science can explain. Miracles are the proof that God is with us.

Jesus' earthly life and His words through the Gospel accounts assure us that eternal life with HIM is within our reach and that there is a reckoning for those who embrace sin and evil. 
Beware of Scams

Why Does Jesus Matter

Why does Jesus matter? St. Dominic has been putting energy and resources into helping people put Jesus at the center of their lives, but why? As an educator, I always seek to understand the why to the what why we do what we do - which provides intentionality. If it doesn't make sense in the grand scheme, is it necessary? If it isn't necessary, if it has no purpose, then why do it? So, is it necessary to put Jesus in the center of your life? YES! Why? Because having a relationship with Jesus is how you are able to experience joy and happiness now and for all eternity. Why wouldn't you want that? We put energy into you because we want to help you know the love and joy of Jesus in your life.

Here is what I have heard from people when confronted with the question of why Jesus isn't a priority, the responses vary: "I am not worthy. .. It is too hard... I don't have time... I don't agree with the Pope...I don't like ____ in the church... or I don't agree with this or that teaching." What does any of this have to do with your ability to know, love, and serve Jesus? Not a single thing. These are all excuses that put convenience over commitment. Jesus committed himself to you through his life, death, and resurrection, commit yourself to Jesus. He's wanting you to do so, desperately. How long will you keep Him waiting?

When something is important, it isn't hard to find the time to do it.

How often have you found yourself saying "I don't have time for prayer... I don't have time to go to Mass... I don't have time to volunteer... I don't have time to read the bible." and so on. Yet, we have time to binge watch our favorite show on Netflix, or read the top selling novel on the New York Times bestseller list into the wee hours of the morning, or get up at 5:00 AM to go to the gym, or check emails/FB/Instagram throughout the day. We make time for those things so why don't we put Jesus first when He is THE most important thing in any of our lives? It is because our priorities are messed up. Again, this is not to place judgement but to give pause. If you say that Jesus is important to you, then I challenge you to prove it. What about you indicates that Jesus is the center of your life? If you say He is the center of your life, then there should be no excuses for anything. No excuses means total surrender.

Take a moment to assess where you are at as a disciple. Do you have a regular prayer routine? Do you break open the Scripture to see what it has to say to you? Do you attend Mass regularly? Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: John 6:1-15. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

In today's Gospel, Jesus satisfies the crowd's spiritual hunger prior to satisfying their physical hunger. Do you know what you hunger for?

One of the most astonishing parts of this passage is that not only does Jesus feed the 5000, but He provides a supra-abundant amount – more than they could actually ever need – from what little He started with. What does this tell us about how Jesus promises to provide for us?

Jesus already had a plan to feed the people, but He asked Phillip what to do to test Him, and Phillip started counting to make sure it would all add up. There is no room to trust Him if we "have it all figured out." What would it look like to trust that God will provide instead?







SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Katherine Drexel

Born in Philadelphia, St. Katherine grew up to become one of the first American-born saints. She was raised in a life of privilege, both financially and spiritually.

After her father's death, St. Katherine considered joining a contemplative order. However, during an audience with the Pope while on a trip to Rome, when she asked for more missionaries to be sent to the American West. The Pope asked her to become a missionary herself! Now known as the Apostle for Social Justice, St. Katherine gave up her inheritance and instead devoted her life to the material and spiritual well-being of Black and Native Americans. She established the Sisters of the Blessed Sacrament for Indians and Colored, and together they opened a boarding school in Santa Fe, the first of 50 missions for Native Americans in 16 states. She also established a system of 63 schools, including Xavier University in New Orleans, the first Catholic university in the United States for African Americans. ©LPI


