

National Shrine & Museum of St. Therese Friday, September 27



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Mercy & Justice

A few weeks ago, I picked up the book *Beautiful Mercy* by the team at Dynamic Catholic (2015). One essay, written by Fr. Mike Schmitz entitled "Tireless Mercy," really resonated with me. In it he states:

Few commands of Christ are more ignored or overlooked than his instruction to forgive others as God has forgiven us. It is not merely that forgiveness is difficult to do; it is that very few people understand what forgiveness really is.

Forgiveness is not saying, "No problem."

Forgiveness is not saying, "There's nothing to forgive."

Forgiveness is not forgetting. Forgiveness does not mean that you

trust the other person.

Forgiveness does not necessarily mean that the relationship is restored.

Forgiveness is not an "event."

There is a process involved in true forgiveness. The Christian ideal of forgiveness involves both mercy and justice. The virtue of justice is the act of giving another what is their due. That sounds a little like revenge, doesn't it? God doesn't' work that way. It is really paying back what you owe. Mercy without justice dishonors everyone involved. As Fr. Mike says:

It is critical for Christians to begin to understand that we cannot have mercy without justice. In the same way that a person cannot be generous with someone else's property (but only with her own), one cannot be merciful unless she knows how much offering mercy will cost her – and still freely chooses to offer mercy. This is what it is to forgive offenses willingly (p.158).

Forgiveness is an act of the will. "When we refuse to forgive someone for harm done to us, we are adding another wrong to the first... We are increasing the quantity of evil in the world, which has quite enough already" (Fr. Jacques Philippe, Interior Freedom, Scepter Publishing, 2002, p.64).

What does the process of forgiveness look like? According to Fr. Mike, there are three steps.

A person must first realize that they have been hurt – all too often we dismiss how we are treated by others ("It's okay," "No big deal") when in fact our dignity as a beloved child of God has been violated.

Since mercy is rooted in justice, one needs to weigh what the other person "owes" them – Forgiveness is not an emotion. It is an act of the will (and grace). Therefore, if a person is going to truly choose mercy, he has to use his intellect to know what mercy will cost. This is an awareness of what the other person has cost you.

After adding up the cost, absorb the cost yourself – follow the example of the king in Mt 18:21-27 who released and forgave a debt. It doesn't mean that all will be well or that the offense won't occur again, but it means you won't be carrying it around. You will become more free in order to be the disciple God needs you to be.

GOING DEEPER

Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 7: 1-8,14-15, 21-23. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

In this passage, Jesus is addressing the fact that laws do not make humanity moral. Morality comes from within the heart. It is easy to follow laws and rules on the outside to impress those around us, but Jesus is challenging us to look inward at our hearts. Reflect on the words of Jesus about defilement coming from within.

Does your exterior actions match your interior actions, or are you living a double life, where you treat people with kindness on the outside, but then judge them interiorly? What is Jesus trying to tell you personally?

Verse 8 says "You have let go of the commands of God and are holding onto human traditions." In what ways have you adopted "cultural Catholicism" instead of knowing, following, loving, and obeying Jesus himself?

SACRAMENTS

Sacramental Preparation

Any child who is of the age of reason (7 years old) and in second grade is eligible to participate in preparation for the sacraments of reconciliation and Eucharist. Children, and all Catholics, need a foundation to grow in their faith. Per archdiocesan guidelines, all children must participate in either faith formation classes or Catholic school for one year prior to their year of preparation. Meaning, all children who will prepare for sacraments in second grade MUST participate in formation or Catholic school in first grade. If you have any questions, please contact the formation department at 262.781.3480.

Is your child baptized? Would you like them to be?

What happens if the reception of the sacrament of baptism has been delayed? Fear not! Children under the age of 7 are able to be welcomed into the Church at any time. If they are older than 7 they are welcomed into the Church through the Order of Christian Initiation for Children. If your child has been baptized but reception of reconciliation and Eucharist has been delayed, they may receive the sacraments after proper formation. 

SAINT OF THE WE



St. Basil the Great

St. Basil the Great was born in 329 at Caesarea of Cappadocia to a family deeply rooted in Christianity. He trained in the law and rhetoric and became a popular teacher. However, his sister persuaded him to give up academia for monastic life. His friend, St. Gregory, invited St. Basil to start an order with him. St. Basil traveled through Egypt, Palestine, and Syria visiting monasteries, learning everything he could, and formulating his own ideas about monastic rule. His rule is still followed today, and he is known as the Father of Eastern Monasticism.

St. Basil fought against Arianism, which denied the divinity of Christ, and other early Trinitarian heresies. He was passionate about caring for the poor and sick, pastoral care, and fighting against institutionalized prostitution. In addition to influential monastic rules, sermons, and doctrinal treatises, more than 300 of his letters still exist. ©LPI


