

After all, we are called to be the hands of Jesus in the world and you can only do that by knowing Him.



Be Opened

After reading today's Gospel a few times, I broke it down into some relatable parts.

There is a deaf person with a speech impediment. This means he is unable to hear/listen and has difficulty expressing himself. He has a perceivable weakness.

Jesus pulls him away and places attention onto those areas of weakness. He opens those areas up.

The man can now hear/listen. He can't stop talking because he is so thrilled about his encounter with Jesus. He is forever changed and wants everyone to know.

As I thought about this, aren't we all like this deaf man with a speech impediment. We all have that "thing" that prevents us from truly hearing others, if not from truly hearing God. We can grow distracted by our own thoughts, our own desires, our own agendas so much so that we can't "hear" anything else. This can make it difficult for us to express ourselves lovingly towards others. Recognizing that, we should and need to be pulled away to spend time with Jesus. While abiding with Him, just as the man in the story did, we need to share all that makes us less than what we were made to be. The man did nothing to be rendered deaf or to have a speech

impediment, but we definitely do things to close our abilities to listen and speak with charity. What weaknesses should you bring to Jesus? In this abiding, we should ask to be opened up. We should ask for the "Ephphatha." We need to come to this space of quiet with Jesus readily and often. We need to pray that our ears and our hearts be opened so that we, like the man, may praise Jesus for His infinite goodness. Like the man, we should never be quiet about it.



Dear Lord,

I humbly seek Your divine guidance and the ability to hear Your voice clearly. Grant me the discernment to understand Your will for my life and the courage to follow it. In my prayers, may I find the answers I need and the strength to trust Your plan for me. Amen.

Life with Jesus

As disciples of The Way, let me run this quote by you from the book "The Religion of the Day: Sequel to From Christendom to Apostolic Mission" by Msgr. James Shea and Dr. Jonathan Reyes:

Christians have always been concerned about the political and cultural order, since it touches on justice and human relations. They know that Christ's life and light can make a significant difference in how things go for individual people and for whole societies. They know that temporal happiness can be more widely disseminated and human suffering significantly curtailed by addressing the architecture of social life. They attempt where possible to see truth, justice, and peace furthered and evil kept at bay. What they do not do is set their hope on fixing the world by human means alone or on replacing the one we have with a better working model. They know that they cannot get at the true root of the world's evil through political and cultural change and that the ultimate destiny of our visible world hangs on far higher invisible realities. (University of Mary Press, 2024, p.109f)







SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Caterina Volpicelli

St. Caterina Volpicelli was born in 1839. She experienced a conversion through conversations with many holy people. She entered the Third Order of the Franciscans, then the Congregation of Perpetual Adorers of the Blessed Sacrament, where her stay was short due to a severe illness. During this time she learned of a movement called the Apostleship of Prayer. This powerful apostleship dedicates each day to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, finding God in every moment, every task. This prayerful way of life and her devotion to the Eucharist, with hours spent in adoration, marked the next stage of her life.

Caterina founded her own order, the Servants of the Sacred Heart, in 1874. Her order opened the orphanage of the Margherites, a lending library, and set up the Association of the Daughters of Mary. St. Caterina participated in the first National Eucharistic Congress in 1891.

Whether it is your first time voting or your fifty-first time voting, exercising our civic responsibilities as a disciple of Jesus Christ can be a challenge. We invite all adults to join us in a three-part series focusing on how to meet our civic responsibilities in light of the gospel teachings of Jesus Christ. These sessions will not tell you how to vote but inform you on what to consider as a Catholic disciple when voting.

SEPTEMBER 24 – VOTING WITH A CONSCIENCE PT. 1

The first part of this three part series will provide a human experience to the foundation for understanding the issues that face our country from a Catholic perspective. The Catholic Social Teachings establish the perspective Catholics are to have when making decisions.

OCTOBER 1 – VOTING WITH A CONSCIENCE PT. 2

The second part of this three part series shares the guidance provided by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops in their document "Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship: A Call to Political Responsibility from the Catholic Bishops of the United States" (2015). This document provides practical guidance to help Catholics exercise their political responsibility well.

OCTOBER 8 – VOTING WITH A CONSCIENCE PT. 3
