

Take Up Your Cross

When I'm interviewing people for my job as a staff writer at an archdiocesan newspaper, I like to ask them this question: at the end of your life, when you meet God, what do you want to hear Him say?

I've gotten a lot of interesting answers.

"I called and you listened."

"What tee time would you like tomorrow?"

"What were you thinking?"

"Your service made things better."

It's a question I've thought a lot about, personally. What I want to hear God say when I finally see His face is this: "You can put it down now."

When Jesus asks his disciples "Who do you say that I am?" he is not just asking them to verbalize an answer.

He is asking them to do something: pick up the cross. Find the problems in this world, in this life, and throw your arms around them. Drag them to God, even if it kills you. It's not enough to stand by the sidelines, watching Christ ascend to Calvary, nodding your head in approval. Yes, I agree. Yes, I believe. Yes, Jesus, good job! You have to follow in every bloody footprint he leaves in the dust. Set your face like flint. And when you

meet him at the top, you better not be empty-handed. He has a cross, he will expect you to have one, too.

I hope that I can do it. I hope that I am strong enough. I am not one of those great, hardy souls. I stumble terribly under the weight of my very small cross. I grumble as I shift it from shoulder to shoulder. But every time I have been almost at the point of giving up, almost ready to lay it down, there is something — Someone — who supports my drooping arm. The Lord God is my help.

If, at the end of everything, I hear the words, "You can put it down now," then I will know I have made it. I will know I have not failed: I took up the cross.

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me." Matthew 16:24



MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Over the nearly 30 years as a Catholic educator. I have been asked countless times how to vote when neither party, let alone candidate, fully represents my beliefs and values. Nonetheless, we do have a moral duty to be politically engaged. The role that the teaching body of the Church plays in the process is with the formation of conscience. The formation of one's conscience begins when we are little and continues to develop throughout our entire lives, even into old age. Our responsibility is to learn what the Church teaches on various topics in order to vote with a conscience: learn, discern, decide.

When exploring the topic of conscience in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (Libreria Editrace Vaticana, 2016), I found these nuggets:

1777 Moral conscience, present at the heart of the person, enjoins him at the appropriate moment to do good and to avoid evil. It also judges particular choices, approving those that are good and denouncing those that are evil. It bears witness to the authority of truth in reference to the supreme Good to which the human person is drawn, and it welcomes the commandments. When he listens to his conscience, the prudent man can hear God speaking.

1778 Conscience is a judgement of reason whereby the human person recognizes the moral quality of a concrete act that he is going to perform, is in the process of performing, or has already completed. In all he says and does,

man is obliged to follow faithfully what he knows to be just and right.

1785 In the formation of conscience the Word of God is the light for our path, we must assimilate it in faith and prayer and put it into practice.

1786 Faced with a moral choice, conscience can make either a right judgment in accordance with reason and the divine law or, on the contrary, an erroneous judgment that departs from them.

1787 Man is sometimes confronted by situations that make moral judgments less assured and decision difficult. But he must always seek what is right and good and discern the will of God expressed in divine law.

1788 To this purpose, man strives to interpret the data of experience and the signs of the times assisted by the virtue of prudence, by the advice of competent people, and by the help of the Holy Spirit and his gifts.

1789 Some rules to apply: one may never do evil so that good may result from it, follow the Golden Rule, charity always proceeds by way of respect for one's neighbor and his conscience.




Thank you!

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 8: 27-35. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.







St. Mary Joseph Rossello

St. Mary Joseph Rossello was born in 1880 in Italy. She entered the third order of Franciscans at the age of 16. However, she longed to dedicate her life to God in a community of sisters. The Lord provided for St. Mary Joseph in the form of the bishop of Savona who recognized in her a unique ability to teach. She and three other young women were given a house, with some rooms made into classrooms, and in 1837 they began the Institute of the Daughters of Our Lady of Mercy, teaching the young and caring for the sick. Mary Joseph professed her vows in 1840. She was appointed Superior General of the order and led the community as mother superior for 40 years.

In 1875 the order opened their first house in the Americas in Buenos Aires, Argentina and continued to grow to more than three thousand sisters in two hundred houses spread across the world. St. Mary Joseph was canonized Pope Pius XII in 1949.

It may be no accident or coincidence that you're reading these words at this very moment. This message may very well have been written explicitly for you. Are you called to discern the ministry of the Permanent Diaconate in the Catholic Church?

The Permanent Diaconate is an ancient and sacred ministry of service dating back to the time of the apostles. Deacons are ministers of charity, the Word, and the altar. They fulfill many functions within the Church, inside and outside of the liturgy. And the Church needs good and faithful men to step up today and ask themselves if they are being called by Almighty God to serve the Church through this commitment to holy orders.

Diaconal ministry works hand in hand with both priestly and lay ministry as a sacrament to bring about the kingdom of God. Deacons are men with a charism and a calling to radical availability for service to the People of God, the Church. The deacon's vocation calls him to collaborate with the bishop and the priests in an exercise of a ministry that is not of their own but the Word of God — calling all to conversion and holiness.
