Sin and Mercy

Some people will object to a teaching of the Church, saying, "The Jesus I know wouldn't say that." I wonder if the Jesus they know would say: "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." Because that's what the actual Jesus said. So, if the Jesus we know wouldn't say that, which "Jesus" do we know?

This is why we have to pray with Scripture. When we pray with Jesus' actual words in the Gospel, we meet him as a person. The objective meeting place of the Gospel breaks us out of our own minds; it prevents us from forming God in our own image.

Today's Gospel is a sobering reminder that Jesus takes sin very seriously.

Gehenna (which becomes the English "hell") is an actual valley southwest of Jerusalem. In that valley, bad kings of Israel's past had sacrificed children to false gods as burnt offerings (2 Chron 28:1-3; 33:6). The prophet Jeremiah—no softy himself—boldly told Jerusalem's leaders that their own corpses would be heaped in this valley as a consequence of their sins (Jer 7:30-33).

This is the kind of destiny Jesus wants to save us from. He encourages us to fight against sin. A fight is painful. A

fight will cost us something. Jesus tells us: that fight is worth it.

But we also pray with each part of Scripture as one element of a unified whole. St. Thérèse of Lisieux (whose feast day is Tuesday) highlights other passages revealing the depth of Jesus's mercy: "I feel that even had I on my conscience every crime one could commit, I should lose nothing of my confidence: my heart broken with sorrow, I would throw myself into the arms of my Saviour. I know that He loves the Prodigal Son, I have heard His words to St. Mary Magdalen, to the woman taken in adultery, and to the woman of Samaria. No one could frighten me, for I know what to believe concerning His Mercy and His Love. And I know that all that multitude of sins would disappear in an instant, even as a drop of water cast into a flaming furnace."

And here lies our hope: Gehenna is not the only furnace. The Sacred Heart of Jesus burns with the flames of divine mercy waiting to be poured out on sinners. Let us throw ourselves into the arms of our Savior.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

10 Habits of Discipleship

We have been trying out some new things in the formation department of St. Dominic Catholic Parish as we explore the many ways we wish to form and equip our fellow disciples of The Way.

One item that we are exploring with members of Pastoral Council and the Discipleship Commission is an exercise called the 10:10 Challenge. It is a guidebook created by our friends at Evangelical Catholic.

The idea is to dedicate 10 weeks with a fellow disciple to exercise 10 ways to a Jesus led-life. The challenge is rooted in John 10:10, "That they might have life and have it more abundantly." The challenge itself is "an invitation to strengthen ten core practices that Jesus himself lived and which make up the ever-ancient, ever new way of discipleship."

Users of the 10:10 Challenge grow in 10 habits of discipleship together. The habits are:

- Pray from the Heart
- Dwell in God's Word
- Grow in Freedom
- Worship the Lord
- Love Your Neighbor
- Encourage One Another
- Follow God's Lead
- Call on Mary and the Saints
- Entrust Your Life to Jesus
- Share the Good News

I have found it to be quite helpful in my own faith development to do these exercises, but also in walking/ accompanying my fellow disciples. The more deeply we train our minds



toward a Christ-centered life, the more we will bring ourselves to share the goodness we gain with others. In a time when we are challenged as disciples by the world around us, we must not fear sharing the Good News with others. If not you, who? If not now, when?

Today's Gospel Reading

Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 9:38-43, 47-48. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

What are you willing to sacrifice to cut sin out of your life and set your gaze on heaven?

Jesus uses very extreme language to talk about sin. Why should we avoid sin? What does this mean for you?

What is your responsibility for furthering the work of Jesus? What is the impact if you don't pursue your responsibilities?

A theme of unity and wholeness runs throughout today's Gospel, indeed through all of Jesus' teaching. He wants His people, His Church, to be united through belief in Him, not divided on technicality. 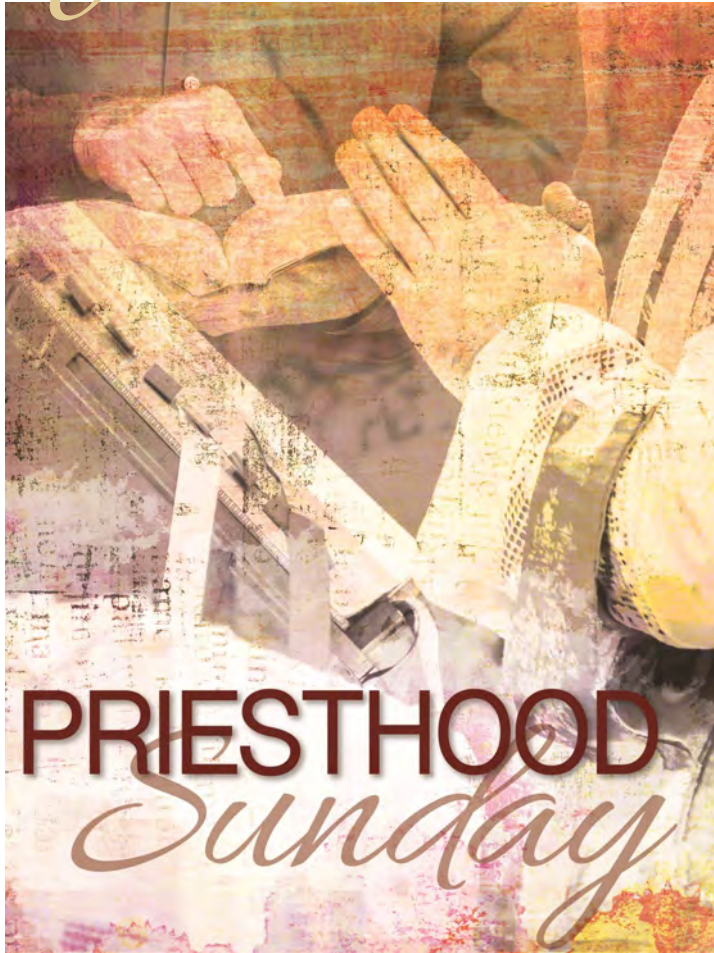

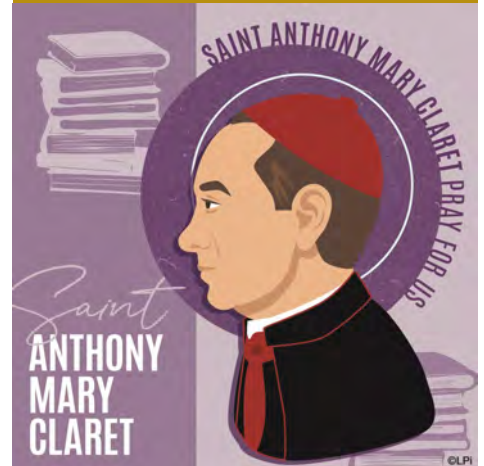

SAINT OF THE WEEK



St. Anthony Mary Claret

St. Anthony Mary Claret is known as the “spiritual father of Cuba.” He was born in Spain in 1807. Ordained a priest in 1835, he became a popular preacher, leading retreats and popular missions where he emphasized the Eucharist. In 1849, the saint founded the Claretians, a religious institute of missionaries, and a companion order of women religious who served as teachers for girls.

As Archbishop of Santiago de Cuba, Cuba, he worked diligently to reform both clergy and laity. He opposed concubinage, instructed black slaves, and championed family-owned farms. These stances were vehemently opposed by many, and Saint Anthony was the target of assassins.

He was recalled to Spain, to act as Queen Isabella II's confessor. While there, he founded the Religious Publishing House and wrote or published 200 Catholic books and pamphlets. He participated in Vatican I where he defended the infallibility of the Pope. ©LPI

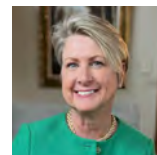

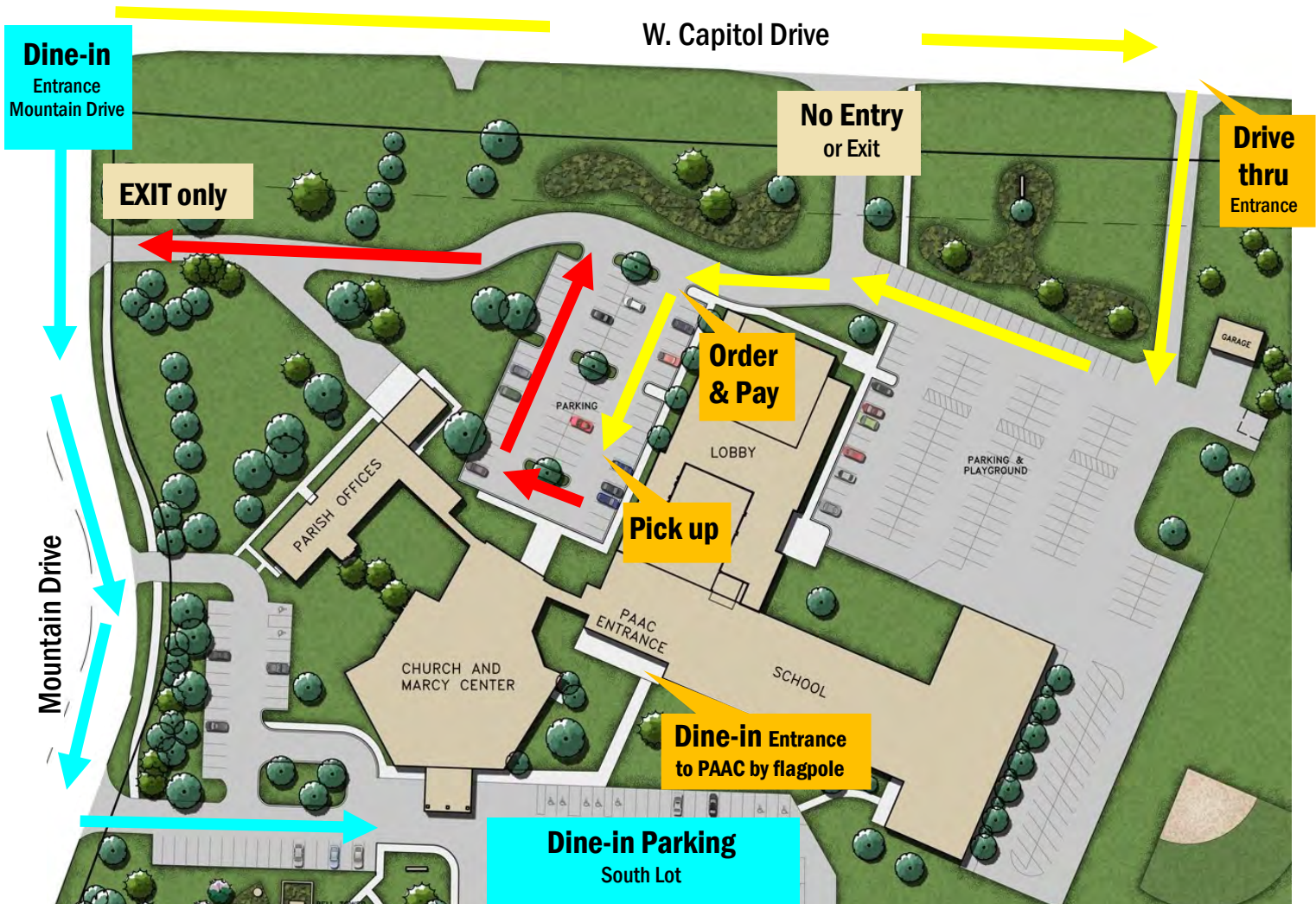
