The “E” Word

Evangelization. You’ve likely heard the word buzzing around the parish a lot the past few years. What comes to mind when you first hear it? On Respect Life Sunday, with an election a month away, it seems like a good time to revisit what this means and what role we must play in evangelizing our world.

I ask everyone in the Missionary Discipleship Training Group the above question during our first session.

For many, it calls to mind images of Jehovah’s Witnesses knocking on their doors. For some, street preachers warning you of eternal damnation. For most, it is a word of condemnation and judging. No wonder people don’t like that word.

But what if we could reclaim a true meaning of that word? After all, it is a command given to us by Jesus in the Gospel. Maybe then we wouldn’t be so afraid of it.

I think the fear of evangelization shifts a bit when we realize that we are all constantly evangelizing and being evangelized—just not necessarily for Christ.

One of my best friends is an avid reader. She has a social media account dedicated to her reviews of books she reads. She is, in a sense, an evangelist for books.

My husband, like any true Scennie, LOVES the Green Bay Packers. He is constantly trying to

convert me, a Chicago born Bears fan, into being a Packers fan. He is, in a sense, an evangelist for the Packers.

Charmin deeply desires you to buy their toilet paper over every other toilet paper brand. Those little bears in the commercials are evangelists for Charmin brand toilet paper.

See, evangelization, if we break down the word, simply means making the

Good News known. Of course, for Christians, the best news we have is that of Jesus Christ and how deeply He loves us. That is the good news we are called to share with others.

We are all evangelists for the things we love. We don't think twice about telling friends they simply have to try this restaurant or watch that show. So why do we hesitate to talk to people about Jesus, the greatest thing we have to share? And is it really any wonder that our culture is devoid of Him if those who love Him most won't talk about Him?

In the same way, we are all constantly being evangelized by something. Commercials evangelize us into the religion of consumerism and materialism. Parenthood culture evangelizes us into excessive busyness and extra-curricular-driven insanity. The Scriptures are the true evangelists, teaching us about the authentic Good News of Jesus Christ and commanding us to share this news with those around us.

Who, or what, is evangelizing you now?

Evangelization doesn't have to be scary. It's as simple as introducing friends to each other – two people you love meeting each other. The truth is, whether or not we want to engage with the concept of evangelization, we are all living in a world that evangelizes us toward OR away from the true Good News—Jesus Christ. Let us all choose to be a part of the movement toward Him.

MISSIONARY DISCIPLESHIP

Bearing Witness

A key element to living The Way, a life centered in Jesus Christ, is growing in your discipleship and your willingness to share it with others. This ability is known as accompaniment. It is your ability to give witness to your love and appreciation for Jesus Christ to others. How this is done is unique to you. However, there are some key ingredients to it. They are probably already things you do.

Recall, review, and retell God moments. This helps us and others understand and appreciate how God works in our lives.

Learn to engage comfortably in "God talk." These are spiritual conversations that uplift, comfort, and challenge.

Make your faith attractive. Sharing our faith is not to muscle others into it but to help them experience the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control.

Pray for the people in your life who struggle to have a relationship with Jesus Christ. Intercede for them. Ask the Lord to use you in the way only you have been created to do.

Invite them into your faithfulness. Ask if they'd like to join you in a faith-focused experience. Even if they say "no," you've planted a seed.

Regardless of how you accompany another, you won't get far if you don't have a relationship with Jesus yourself. To help you grow in your relationship, you must pursue a

relationship. This can be done through prayer, study, and action. While the staff of St. Dominic provides many opportunities to form and equip the disciples in our midst, not everything is as accessible as we wish it were. Therefore, we like to make you aware of resources that can help. Strength Training for the Soul is a podcast developed by a fellow parishioner and designed to help you grow in spiritual strength so you can deepen your relationship with Jesus Christ. Join each week for faith-filled conversations with some familiar voices that dive into how we can cultivate a closer connection with our Lord.

Whether you're new to the Catholic walk or looking to renew your relationship with God, this podcast will offer the encouragement and guidance you need to build your faith from the inside out. Tune in, and let's begin this journey together!

Today's Gospel Reading

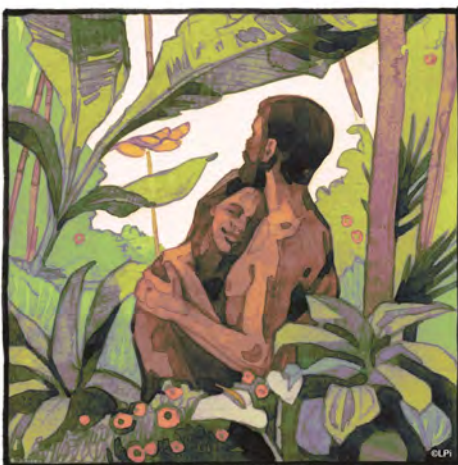
Take a moment to sit with today's Gospel: Mark 10:2-16. Allow the Spirit to work in you, with you, and through you.

The role of the Pharisees in ancient times were to police the 613 laws established in the Old Testament. Jesus came to abolish the laws which were a sign of the old covenant because He was establishing a new covenant.

Jesus draws the Pharisees back to the beginning of creation when there were two commandments: be fruitful and multiply, and do not eat of the tree.

What is Jesus ultimately teaching the Pharisees about the laws of faith? Divorce was not meant to be part of God's creation. It is a part of our broken reality. Knowing this, how does that affect your understanding of Jesus's words?

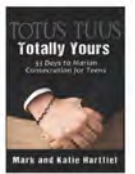

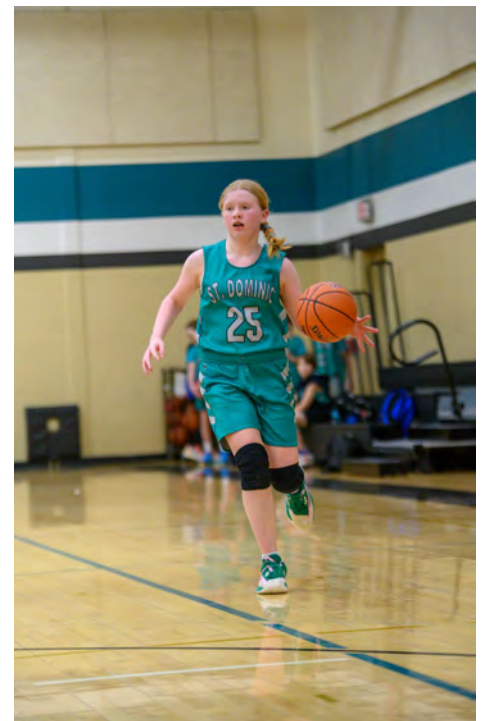

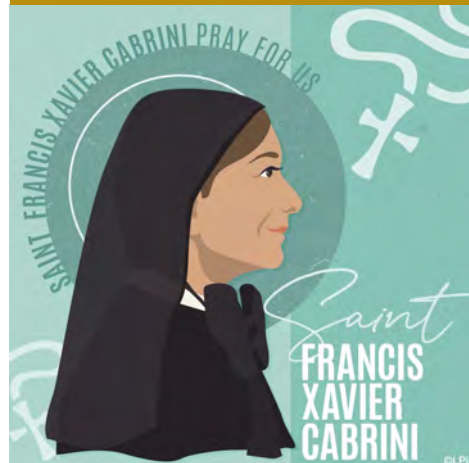

SAINT OF THE WEEK

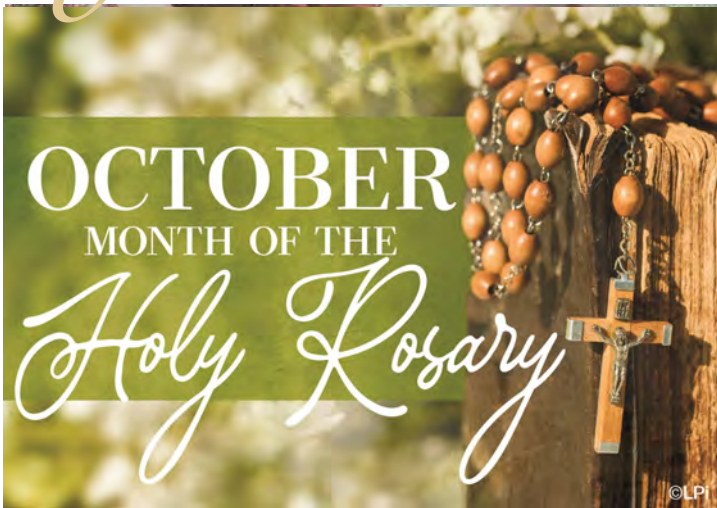


St. Francis Cabrini

St. Frances Xavier Cabrini was born in Italy in 1850. She dreamed of being a missionary. She worked as a teacher and administrator at an orphanage run by the Sisters of Providence. In September 1877, she made her vows. St. Francis founded the Institute of the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and, in 1887, sought an audience with Pope Leo XIII, to seek permission to go as missionaries to China. However, they were sent to New York to serve Italian immigrants in 1889, providing education and healthcare within the Italian Catholic immigrant community.

St. Frances followed and served Italian immigrants across the U.S. She also founded institutions in Central and South America and Europe. Overall, she established 67 schools, hospitals, and orphanages. She was also known for her deep spirituality, often entering a trancelike state during Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament. ©LPI
